Vision of: A Lampstand, Bowl, 7 Spouts, and Two Olive Trees

Working Outline > Zechariah 4:1-7 (Paragraphs ¶ from NAS Bible)

- X. A Lampstand, Bowl, 7 Spouts, and Two Olive Trees 4:1-7 ¶ (Feb 15th) (519BC) (at Night)
 - A. 1 Then the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me (Zechariah) returned and roused me,
 - 1. as (Simile) a man who is awakened from his sleep.
 - B. 2 He (Jesus) said to me (Zechariah), "What do you see?"
 - 1. And I (Zechariah) said, "I see, and behold, a lampstand all of gold
 - a. with its (lampstand's) bowl on the top of it (lampstand),
 - b. and its (lampstand's) seven lamps on it (lampstand)
 - c. with seven spouts belonging to each of the (7) lamps which are on the top of it;
 - 2. 3 also two olive trees by it (the bowl), (Jer 11:15–17)
 - a. one (olive tree) on the right side of the bowl
 - b. and the other (olive tree) on its (the bowl's) left side."
 - C. 4 Then I (Zechariah) said to the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me (Zechariah) saying,
 - 1. "What are these (lampstand + bowl + two olive trees), my lord (Jesus)?"
 - a. 5 So the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me (Zechariah) answered and said to me,
 - b. "Do you not know what these (lampstand + bowl + 2 olive trees) are ?" (Zech 4:11-14)
 - c. And I (Zechariah) said, "No, my lord (Jesus)." [Don't call angels Lord]
 - 2. 6 Then he (Jesus) said to me, "This is the word of the Lord (the Father) to Zerubbabel saying,
 - a. 'Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,' says the Lord of hosts (the Father).
 - 3. 7 'What are you, O great mountain?
 - a. Before Zerubbabel you (great mountain of Zion?) will become a plain;
 - b. and he (Zerubbabel) will bring forth the top stone (Capstone of Temple)
 - i. with shouts of "Grace, grace to it (the Temple)!" '"

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 4:1-7

Vision of: A Lampstand, Bowl, 7 Spouts, and Two Olive Trees

Q1: WHAT 5 things did Zechariah see, in Verse 2 & 3? SEE CHARTS

A1: (1) a Lampstand all of gold, (2) a bowl on the top of the Lampstand, (3) seven lamps on the Lampstand, (4) seven spouts above the seven lamps (5) two olive trees by it (the bowl), on Left and Right side

Aaron and His Sons (as Priests) Shall Keep the Light

"In the tent of meeting, outside the veil which is before the testimony, Aaron and his sons shall keep it in order from evening to morning before the LORD;

it shall be a <u>perpetual statute</u> throughout their generations for the sons of Israel, <u>Exodus 27:21</u>



What we know:

The Intended Audience: was the Nation of Israel, thru Zerubbabel and Priest Joshua

Lampstands in the Tabernacle and the Temple

The Purpose for the Tabernacle Lampstand was to shed Light in the Holy Place, Ex 25:37, Num 8:2, Heb 9:2

The seven lamps constantly lit up the Holy Place, Ex 25:37, Num 8:2, Heb 9:2

The Lampstand was meant to burn perpetually (forever), Exodus 27:20-21

The High Priest filled the Lampstand with Olive Oil in the Holy Place, Exodus 25, Lev 24:3

Lampstand in Zechariah

Zechariah 4:2

2 And I said, "I see, and behold, a lampstand all of gold with its bowl on the top of it, and its seven lamps on it with seven spouts belonging to each of the lamps which are on the top of it; a lampstand all of gold with seven lamps

The 2 Olive Trees, next to the Bowl, Zech 4:3

The 2 Olive Trees probably represent the Nation of Israel, Jer 11:16, Rom 11:24

The 2 Olive Trees Branches, beside the 2 Golden Pipes, Zech 4:12

The 2 Olive Branches "empty the golden oil from themselves", Zech 4:12

IF the 2 Olive Branches are "the two anointed ones", Zech 4:14

THEN "the two anointed ones" are the source of the golden oil

AND "the two anointed ones" "are standing by the Lord of the whole earth", Zech 4:14

"the two anointed ones" or the 2 Olive Tree Branches

Most Commentators say, "the two anointed ones" are probably Zerubbabel and Joshua
The Two, Zerubbabel and Joshua, are "the anointed (with Oil) Ones" set apart by God.

Anointed with Oil > symbolized their being set apart (sanctified or made holy) for the purposes of God,
to serve as a King or as a Priest or as a Government Leader, Ex 40:15, Num 3:3

Anointed with Oil > also symbolizes the Holy Spirit because of the work He does in God's people.
The Oil itself has no empowering but the Holy Spirit, the Oil symbolizes, does.

Levitical priests were Anointed with Oil for a <u>perpetual</u> priesthood, Exodus 40:15, Numbers 3:3 Believers "have been Anointed by the Holy One", 1 John 2:20, 2:27 and are Priests, 1 Pet 2:5, 9 "God Anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit", Acts 10:38, Luke 4:18

Joshua was Anointed with Oil for a <u>perpetual priesthood</u> and <u>Zerubbabel</u> for <u>His Governing Israel</u>.

IF <u>Zerubbabel</u> and <u>Joshua</u> "are the two *anointed ones* who are <u>standing by the Lord</u>", in <u>Zech 4:14</u>

THEN <u>they</u> are the two (<u>Zerubbabel</u> and <u>Joshua</u>) who <u>the Lord</u> stirred up <u>their spirits</u>, in <u>Read</u> Hag 1:14

The 2 Olive Branches called "the two anointed ones", supplied the Olive Oil for the Lampstand, Zech 4:14. In this Vision: the Lampstand was perpetually filled with an endless supply of Oil by the 2 Olive Branches, called "the two anointed ones" who are the two, Zerubbabel and Joshua, who will perpetually, supply Light to the Nation of Israel as Governing Leader and Priest.

They are the Light to Israel, empowered by the Holy Spirit as Purposed by the Lord.

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 4:1–7 [Continued]
Vision of: A Lampstand, Bowl, 7 Spouts, and Two Olive Trees

The angel (Jesus) doesn't answer Zechariah's question of WHAT these things were, in Verse 5

Q2: What was Zechariah to tell Zerubbabel, the one in charge of Finishing the Temple, in Verse 6
A2: 'Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,' says the Lord of hosts (the Father).

Zerubbabel was to know that what he was doing was by the Power of the Spirit and NOT anything else.

Any obstacle, including a **Mountain**, will become a **Plain** OR No Obstacle for **Zerubbabel**, in Verse 7 **He** (**Zerubbabel**) will bring forth the **top stone** (Capstone or Completion of **Temple**)

with shouts of "Grace, grace to it (the **Temple**)!", Verse 7 (Fulfilled prophecy, in Ezra 6:22)

Zerubbabel began and finished the **foundation** only of **Ezra's Temple**, in **536 BC**, Ezra 3:2, 8-11

Zerubbabel began again to work on **the Temple Structure**, in **520 BC**, **Read** Ezra 5:1-2

Zechariah's **Prophecy** concerning **Zerubbabel** Completing **the Temple** by the Power of **the Spirit** was given in **539BC**, in Zech 4:7

Zerubbabel finished the work on **the Temple Structure** 4 years later, in **515 BC**, **Read** Ezra 6:14-15 Therefore: **Zechariah's Prophecy**, in **Zech** 4:7, was Fulfilled!

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"The hands of Zerubbabel (governor) have laid the foundation of this house (Temple), (Ezra 3:2, 8, 10, 11)
      and his hands will (in Future) finish it (the Temple structure). (Ezra 6:14-15), in Verse 9
Then you (Zechariah) will know that the Lord of hosts (the Father) has sent me (Jesus) to you. Verse 9
The Fulfillment of the words of "me (Jesus)" will cause you (Zechariah) to know that Jesus was sent
      by the Father to (Zechariah). This Prophecy is then Validated as true!
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Q1: WHAT are "these seven", as described in Verse 10? A1: these (seven eyes) are the eyes of the Lord (Zech 1:10, 3:9, 4:10, 6:4-7, 2 Chr 16:9, Rev 5:6) which range to and fro (patrol, go about) throughout the earth." (Zech 1:10)

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This is the ALL SEEING attribute of the Lord
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The Lord at Times is seen as sending Horses/Angels to Patrol the Earth to SEE, (Zech 1:10-11, 6:4-7) These Horses/Angels are > "the four spirits of heaven", Zech 6:5 4 Then I spoke and said to the angel who was speaking with me, "What are these, my lord?" 5 The angel replied to me, "These are the four spirits of heaven, going forth after standing before the Lord of all the earth, **6** with one of which the **black horses** are going forth to the north country; and the **white ones** go forth after **them**, while the **dappled ones** go forth to the south country. 7 "When the strong ones went out, they were eager to go to patrol the earth." And **He** said, "Go, patrol the earth." So they patrol the earth. Zechariah 6:4–7

The Lord at Times is seen as sending the seven Spirits of God about the Earth to SEE And I saw between the throne (with the four living creatures) and the elders a Lamb standing, as if slain, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God, sent out into all the earth. Here the Lamb (Jesus) is seen as having seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God, Rev 5:6

The Lord at Times is seen as sending the eyes of the Lord about the Earth to SEE "For the eyes of the Lord move to and fro throughout the earth that He may strongly support those whose heart is completely His, 2 Chron 16:9

Here the eyes of the Lord is seen as moving to and fro throughout the earth, ALL SEEING

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 4:11–14
Vision of: A Lampstand, Bowl, 7 Spouts, and Two Olive Trees
First: Zechariah asks to him (Jesus), "What are these two olive trees, in Verse 11.
Second: Zechariah asks to him (Jesus), "What are these two olive branches, in Verse 12.
Jesus then answers the Second Question about branches, But Not the First Question about trees.
Then Jesus answers, "Do you (Zechariah) not know what these (olive branches) are?", in Verse 13
Q1: WHAT are the two olive branches according to Jesus, in Verse 14?
A1: these (two olive branches) are the two anointed ones
Q1: Then WHAT are the two anointed ones, in Verse 14, as said previously?
A1: the two anointed ones
Most Commentators say, "the two anointed ones" are probably Zerubbabel and Joshua
     The Two, Zerubbabel and Joshua, are "the anointed (with Oil) Ones" set apart by God.
The two Witness in Book of Revelation, have similarities with Zerubbabel and Joshua
Revelation 11:3-4
3 "And I will grant authority to my two witnesses, and they will prophesy for
      twelve hundred and sixty days, clothed in sackcloth."
4 These (two witnesses) are the two olive trees and the two lampstands
      that stand before the Lord of the earth.
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Compare Rev 11:4 with Zech 4:14

The "two witnesses" are referred to as "the two olive trees" and "the two lampstands", in Rev 11:4

"the two olive trees" we said symbolize the Nation of Israel, in Zechariah 4

"the two lampstands" we said symbolize the Light of Israel, in Zechariah 4

The "two witnesses" "that stand before the Lord of the earth', in Rev 11:4

The "two olive branches" "who are standing by the Lord of the whole earth', Zech 4:14
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
