- A. Lebanon, Bashan, and Jordan your Glorious Trees will be Destroyed and Ruined, 11:1–3
 - 1. 1 Open your doors, O Lebanon, That a fire may feed on your cedars.
 - 2. 2 Wail, O cypress (juniper),
 - a. for (Reason) the cedar has fallen,
 - b. Because (Reason) the glorious trees have been destroyed;
 - 3. Wail, O oaks of Bashan,
 - a. **For** (Reason) the impenetrable **forest** has <u>come down</u>.
 - 4. 3 There is a sound of the shepherds' (leaders of Israel) wail,
 a. For (Reason) their (shepherds') glory is ruined;

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 11:1-3

First Oracle (Part 4), Future, Shepherd the Flock of Israel and Judah, Doomed to Slaughter, 11:1-17

A. Lebanon, Bashan, and Jordan your Glorious Trees will be Destroyed and Ruined,11:1–3 ¶ Here in these 3 Verses, it speaks of 3 areas of the Land of Israel, Lebanon, Bashan, and Jordan that were heavily forested by 3 types of trees: Cedars, Cypress, and Oaks. These Forests are described as being

Burned by Fire, Destroyed, Fallen, Coming Down, and Ruined.

The word "<u>Wail</u>" or Cry Out is used 3 times as a reaction to "the <u>glorious trees</u> have been <u>destroyed</u>" Then it says "the <u>shepherds' <u>Wail</u>", "For (Reason) <u>their</u> (shepherds') <u>glory</u> is <u>ruined</u>".</u>

Looking at the entire Chapter 11 and Zech 11:4, this is concerning:

the Shepherds or Leaders of Israel Wailing, Because of their being Destroyed or Ruined.

The Lord is concerned that the Shepherds of Israel are Not Overseeing the Flock of Israel

- so **the Lord** will **JUDGE** (<u>Destroy</u> and <u>Ruin</u>) **them**. **Read** Jer 25:34-38
- In Verse 3, "the young lions' roar, For (Reason) the pride of the Jordan is ruined".

"the young lions" is used 25 times in the Old Testament.

"young lions" often refers to Nations that will <u>destroy</u> Israel, as seen in Isaiah 5:29-30 when Assyria <u>destroyed</u> and captured Northern Israel. **Read** Isaiah 5:29-30

In Chapter 10, The Lord will Bless, Strengthen, and Regather Israel, 10:1-12 In Chapter 11, The Shepherds of the Flock of Israel and Judah, are Doomed to Slaughter, 11:1-17

Read Paragraph > Zechariah 11:4–6

 - 2. 5 "Those (nations) who buy them (Israel) slay them (Israel) and go unpunished,
 - a. and each of **those** (nations) who <u>sell **them** (Israel)</u> says,
 - i. 'Blessed be the LORD, for I (nations) have become rich!'
 - 3. And their (Israel's) own shepherds (leaders) have <u>no pity</u> (mercy) on them (Israel).
 - 6 "For (Reason) I will no longer have <u>pity</u> (mercy) on the inhabitants of the land (of Israel)," declares the LORD;

Thus says the LORD, Shepherd the flock of Israel, Doomed to Slaughter, 11:4–6 ¶

In Verse 4, the Lord tells Zechariah to (Shepherd) the flock (sheep) doomed to slaughter.

This reveals that **the sheep** or **people of Israel** are **doomed**, by **the Lord**, **to slaughter** or being **killed**. **Zechariah** is Prophesying this about a Future Time when the **people of Israel** will be **killed**.

<mark>Q1:</mark> WHAT will those **nations** do to the <u>doomed to slaughter</u> people of Israel, in Verse 5a ? A1:

<mark>Q2:</mark> WHAT is the Problem with "**their** (Israel's) own **shepherds** (leaders)", in Verse 5b ? A2:

Q3: WHAT 3 Main Things will the Lord "Do" or "Not Do" for the people of Israel, in Verse 6 ?

The Lord tells Zechariah to (Shepherd) the flock, the people of Israel.

Because Israel's own shepherds (leaders) have <u>no pity</u> or <u>mercy</u> on the people of Israel.

Because the people of Israel are <u>doomed to slaughter</u> or being killed.

This will happen:

Because The Lord will no longer have <u>no pity</u> or <u>mercy</u> on the people of Israel.

He will cause the men (of Israel) to fall, under the power of another king and not deliver them.

There are some who are ready to state that it is <u>not certain what invasion</u> is referred to here. However, <u>the context of the rest of the chapter</u> is determining and it points unmistakably to **the judgment** which resulted from **the rejection of the Shepherd of Israel**, that <u>destruction</u> and **killing** of **the land** and **people** in **AD 70** by the **Romans**.

 - 1. **7 So** (Reason) I (the Lord) <u>pastured</u> (shepherded) the flock (sheep) doomed to <u>slaughter</u>, 11:4
 - a. hence (Reason) the <u>afflicted</u> of the flock (sheep) I (the Lord) <u>pastured</u> (shepherded).
 - b. And I (the Lord) took for myself two staffs (of Israel):
 - c. the one (staff) I (the Lord) called Favor (11:10)
 - d. and the other (staff) I (the Lord) called Union; (11:14)
 - e. **so** (Reason) I (the Lord) <u>pastured</u> (shepherded) (past) the flock.
 - 2. 8 Then I (the Lord) annihilated (past) the three shepherds (leaders of Israel) in one month,

 Favor Definition: "Pleasant" or "Beauty"
 the other (staff) called Union (the Lord) (shepherded)
 Union Definition: "Cord" or "Band"

8 Then I (the Lord) <u>annihilated</u> (past) the three shepherds (leaders of Israel) in one month, [Probably (the leaders of Israel) > (1) the Priests (2) the Elders (3) the Scribes]
Q1: In Verse 8, WHAT 2 Reasons are given for WHY the Lord <u>annihilated</u> the three shepherds
A1: the Lord did this: (1) In Verse 9, "(the Lord) said, "I will <u>not pasture</u> (shepherd) you (the people of Israel)" Q2: Therefore, WHAT 3 Things is the Lord going to allow to happen ? A2: (1)

9......For they (Israel) did not continue in My covenant, And I did not care for them, says the Lord.

The Lord took Two Staffs: Concerning Shepherding Israel

The Lord's Staff Favor >

symbolized Israel's Divine <u>Favor</u> Covenant they had with the Lord, He <u>Was</u> their shepherd, **Read** Deut 7:6 + Acts 13:17

The cutting or breaking of the Lord's Staff Favor > Broke Israel's Divine Favor symbolized the Lord's breaking His Covenant of Divine Favor with Israel, He Was Not their Shepherd any longer

The Lord's Staff Union >

symbolized Israel's Divine Union Covenant they had with the Lord, as all 12 Tribes of Israel, Deut 7:6, became United under David, 2 Sam 5:1–3 The cutting or breaking of the Lord's Staff Union > Broke Israel's Divine Union symbolized the breaking of the brotherhood or Union of 12 Tribes of Israel > breaking into N. Israel and S. Judah, when Solomon Dies, 1 Kings 11:42-43, Kingdom was Divided, Read 1 Kings 12:16-20, Division from the Lord', Read 1 Kings 12:21-24

BUT > "Union" between, 12 Tribes of Israel > will be <u>Restored</u> in the last days, Two Sticks, Ezek 37:15–18

11 So (Reason) it (the Lord's Covenant) was broken on that day (previously), and thus the <u>afflicted</u> of the flock (sheep) who were watching me (Zechariah) realized that it was the word of the LORD.

The Lord's Covenant with Israel was broken on that day (in the past),

Because >

Hebrews 8:8-9

8 For (the Lord) finding fault with them (Israel),

9......For they (Israel) did not continue in My covenant, And I did not care for them, says the Lord.

The Lord's Wages > thirty shekels of silver

In Verse 12, the Lord asks Israel, if it is Good in their sight, for His Wages (payment for work done). Q4: So WHAT Wages did Israel give the Lord ? A4:

Q5: In Verse 13, Then WHAT did the Lord tell Zechariah to do with, the thirty shekels of silver ? A5:

Read Matt 27:3-10
Matthew 27:6-10
6 The chief priests took the pieces of silver and said,
"It is not lawful to put them (silver) into the temple treasury, since it (the 30 pieces) is the price of blood."
7 And they..... with the money bought the Potter's Field as a burial place for strangers (gentiles).
8 For this reason that (Potter's) field has been called the Field of Blood to this day. (Acts 1:18-19)
9 Then that which was spoken through Jeremiah (Jer 32:6-9 and Zechariah) the prophet was fulfilled: "And they (chief priests) took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of the one whose price had been set by the sons of Israel;
10 and they (chief priests) gave them (the 30 pieces) for the Potter's Field,

as the Lord directed me (Zechariah)."

Prophecy Fulfilled Zechariah's Prophecy, Zech 11:12-13, was <u>Fulfilled</u> by **Religious leaders of Israel**, in Matt 27:9-10

Zechariah threw (the 30 shekels) to the potter in the house (Temple) of the LORD, Zech 11:13 Judas threw the pieces of silver into the temple sanctuary, Matt 27:5

(the 30 pieces of silver) is the price of blood, whose price had been set by the sons of Israel, Matt 27:9

the Religious leaders of Israel, in time of Zechariah, saw the Lord, as worth (30 pieces of silver), Zech 11:12 They Paid, the price of innocent blood, of the people
the Religious leaders of Israel, in time of Jesus, saw Jesus, as worth (30 pieces of silver), Zech 11:12 They Paid, the price of innocent blood, of Jesus

Judas saw Jesus, as worth (30 pieces of silver), Matt 27:4

Judas <u>Received</u>, the price of innocent blood, BUT for guilt <u>threw</u> the (30 pieces of silver) away. the <u>Religious leaders of Israel</u>, used the (30 pieces of silver), the price of innocent blood, of Jesus to buy the Potter's Field, as the Lord had directed Zechariah previously.

14 Then I (the Lord) <u>cut</u> in pieces my (the Lord's) second staff Union, to break the brotherhood between Judah (S. Israel) and Israel (N. Israel).
The Lord's Staff Union > (Repeated from Previous Page) symbolized Israel's Divine Union Covenant they had with the Lord, as all 12 Tribes of Israel, Deut 7:6, became United under David, 2 Sam 5:1–3
The cutting or breaking of the Lord's Staff Union > Broke Divine Union symbolized the breaking of the brotherhood or Union of 12 Tribes of Israel >

Read Paragraph > Zechariah 11:15–17

 - 3. but (Contrast) (the uncaring shepherd) will
 - a. devour the flesh of the fat sheep (the people) (Ezek 34:3)

 - 4. 17 "Woe to the <u>worthless shepherd</u> (leader of Israel) Who <u>leaves</u> the flock (sheep)! (Jer 23:1) a. A sword will be on his (shepherd's) arm And on his right eye!
 - b. His (shepherd's) arm will be totally withered, And his right eye will be blind"

The LORD will raise up a worthless Shepherd who will not care for the flock , 11:15–17 ¶

This entire chapter is concerned with the Shepherding of the Flock of Israel.

- I. Shepherd the Flock, of Israel and Judah, Doomed to Slaughter, 11:1-17
 - A. Lebanon, Bashan, and Jordan your Glorious Trees will be Destroyed and Ruined, 11:1–3 \P
 - The Lord is concerned that the Shepherds of Israel are <u>Not</u> Overseeing the Flock of Israel
 so the Lord will JUDGE (<u>Destroy</u> and <u>Ruin</u>) them.
 - B. Thus says the LORD, Shepherded the flock of Israel, Doomed to Slaughter, 11:4–6 ¶
 - C. I, the LORD, Shepherded the flock of Israel, Doomed to Slaughter, as Two Staffs, 11:7–14 ¶
 - D. The LORD will raise up a Worthless Shepherd who will not care for the flock , 11:15–17 \P
 - The Shepherds of Israel were Not Overseeing the Flock of Israel, 11:1–3
 - So, the Lord will and did JUDGE (Destroy and Ruin) the Shepherds of Israel, 11:1–3
 - Therefore, the Flock of Israel was without a Shepherd or Overseer
 - Also, the Lord <u>Stopped</u> Shepherding or <u>Overseeing</u> the Flock of Israel, 11:7–14
 - Therefore, No One was Shepherding or Overseeing the Flock of Israel

Q1: HOW will **the Lord, Doom to Slaughter, the Flock of Israel** ?

A2: the Lord is "going to <u>raise up</u> a (foolish, worthless) <u>shepherd</u> (of Israel) in the land", 11:15–16 Who (the foolish, worthless <u>shepherd</u>) will (Ezek 34:2-4)

not care for the perishing (sheep), (not) seek the scattered (sheep), (not) heal the broken (sheep), But, devour the fat sheep (the people) (Ezek 34:3) and tear off their (the people's) hoofs.

This Future Foolish Shepherd is a wicked; foolishness and wickedness often go together, (Eccl 10:13). The Lord allows this foolish shepherd full sway, and he cruelly mistreats the Flock of Israel. But, The Lord will JUDGE this foolish, worthless, wicked shepherd: his arm (sword, power, Ezek 30:22) will be withered, 11:17 and his eye (seeing, intelligence) will be darkened, 11:17 This foolish, worthless, wicked shepherd, is more than likely, the Antichrist, Dan 7:24-27
