- XXVI. Second Oracle (Part 1), Future, The Lord's Concern for Jerusalem, in that day, 12:1-14
 - A. The Oracle of the word of the LORD, Concerning Israel, Judah, and Jerusalem, 12:1-5 ¶
 - 1. 1 The burden (oracle) of the word of the LORD concerning Israel.
 - 2. Thus declares the LORD
 - a. who stretches out the heavens, (Isa 42:5, Isa 44:24, Jer 51:15, Heb 1:10)
 - b. (who) lays the foundation of the earth, (Isa 42:5, Jer 51:15, Heb 1:10)
 - c. and (who) forms the spirit of man within him, (Num 16:22, Gen 2:7)
 - 3. 2 "Behold, I am going to make Jerusalem
 - a. a cup that <u>causes</u> reeling (staggering) to all the (surrounding) peoples around;
 - b. and when the siege (armed force) is against Jerusalem, (Ezek 38:14-16, Rev 19:17-21)
 - c. it (armed force) will also be <u>against</u> Judah.
 - 4. 3 "It will come about in that day
 - a. that I (the LORD) will make Jerusalem a heavy stone for all the peoples (nations);
 - b. all (peoples) who lift it (Stone, Jerusalem) will be severely injured.
 - c. And **all the nations** of **the earth** will be <u>gathered</u> against **it** (Jerusalem). (12:9, 14:2)
 - 5. 4 "In that day," declares the LORD,
 - a. "I will strike every horse with bewilderment and (strike) his rider with madness.
 - b. But (Contrast) I will watch over the house of Judah,
 - c. while I (the LORD) <u>strike</u> every **horse** of the peoples with <u>blindness</u>.
 - 6. 5 "Then the clans (Leaders) of Judah will say in their hearts,
 - a. 'A strong <u>support</u> for us (Leaders) are the inhabitants of Jerusalem
 - i. through the LORD of hosts, their (inhabitant's) God.'

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 12:1-5

Second Oracle (Part 1), Future, The Lord's Concern for Jerusalem, in that day, 12:1-14 A. The Oracle of the word of the LORD, Concerning Israel, Judah, and Jerusalem, 12:1-5 ¶

In this passage, the Prophecy is "<u>concerning Israel</u>" and "<u>Jerusalem</u>". It speaks of a "<u>siege</u>" or armed force coming "<u>against</u> Jerusalem". "All the Nations will be <u>gathered against</u>" Jerusalem. The Lord will defend Jerusalem and "strike every horse" and "rider" of the attacking "All Nations".

In Verse 1,

Before focusing on the "**siege**" on Jerusalem, certain specific Powers of **the Lord** are mentioned. The Lord "who" "stretches" the heavens and "lays" the Earth and "forms" the spirit of man,

Read Isa 42:5 + Isa 44:24 Other Verses (Jer 51:15, Heb 1:10)

The Lord, in His noted Power, will carry out in Jerusalem, all that proclaimed in Verses 2-5.

In Verse 2 it says,

"the Lord going to make Jerusalem a cup that causes reeling (staggering)

to all the (surrounding) peoples"

Q1: WHEN will this "reeling (staggering) to **all the** (surrounding) **peoples**" take place, in Verse 2?

A1: WHEN the siege (armed force), of "all the (surrounding) peoples" is <u>against</u> Jerusalem, and also be <u>against</u> Judah.

This is one of Many Battles or Wars with the Gentile Nations, leading up to the Second Coming.

In Verse 3 it says,

"It will <u>come about</u> **in that day**"

Jerusalem will be a "heavy (weighty) stone" "for all the peoples (nations)",

BECAUSE all (peoples) who lift it (Stone, Jerusalem)" "will be severely injured"

"for **all the peoples** (nations)" OR "**all the nations** of **the earth**" will be <u>gathered</u> against **it** (Jerusalem). **Read** Zech 12:9

In that day, "all the Nations", will be <u>gathered</u> against Jerusalem, to siege it with Armies.

In Verse 4,

Q2a: WHAT 3 Things will the Lord do to the Gentile Nations Armies, Horses and Riders, "In that day" ? A2a: (1) "I will strike every Horse > with <u>bewilderment</u>

(2) and (strike) **his** (Horse's) **rider** > with <u>madness</u>.

(3) while I (the LORD) <u>strike</u> every **Horse** of the peoples > with <u>blindness</u>.

Q2b: But, WHAT will the Lord do for the house of Judah ?

A2b: BUT (in Contrast) the Lord will <u>watch over</u> (have an open eye toward) the house of Judah The Lord will intervene on behalf of Judah and Jerusalem and will Strike the Nations Armies.

This Not **the Second Coming** of Jesus, But a preliminary Attack on Jerusalem.

In Verse 5,

"Then, the clans (Leaders) of Judah will say in their hearts,

'A strong <u>support</u> for **us** (Leaders) are the **inhabitants** of Jerusalem

through the LORD of hosts, their (inhabitant's) God.'

The leaders of Judah will know "in their hearts" the LORD of hosts intervened on their behalf, He watched over them, by striking the enemy with afflictions, with No Death Mentioned.

Read Paragraph > Zechariah 12:6–9

Second Oracle (Part 1 of 3), Future, The Lord's Concern for Jerusalem, in that day, 12:1-14

- Working Outline > Zechariah 12:6–9 (Paragraphs ¶ from NAS Bible)
 - B. In that day, the LORD will <u>defend</u> against all the nations that <u>come</u> against Jerusalem, 12:6–9 ¶
 1. 6 "In that day I will make the clans (Leaders) of Judah
 - a. like a firepot among pieces of wood and (Like) a flaming torch among sheaves (grain),
 - b. so they (Leaders) will <u>consume</u> on the right hand and on the left
 - i. (consume) all the surrounding peoples (nations),
 - c. while the inhabitants of Jerusalem again <u>dwell</u> on their own sites in Jerusalem.
 - 2. 7 "The LORD also will save the tents of Judah first, (Jer 30:18, Amos 9:11)
 - a. so that (Reason) the glory of the house of David
 - i. and the glory of the inhabitants of Jerusalem
 - ii. <u>will not</u> be <u>magnified</u> above Judah.
 - 3. 8 "In that day the LORD will defend the inhabitants of Jerusalem, (Jos 23:10)
 - a. and the one who is feeble among them in that day will be like David,
 - b. and the house of David will be like God,
 - c. (house of David) like the angel of the LORD before them (inhabitants). (Ex 14:19)
 - 4. 9 "And in that day I (the LORD) will set about (seek) to
 - a. <u>destroy</u> all the nations that <u>come</u> against Jerusalem. (12:3)

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 12:6–9

Second Oracle (Part 1), Future, The Lord's Concern for Jerusalem, in that day, 12:1-14

B. In that day, the LORD will defend against all the nations that come against Jerusalem, 12:6–9 ¶

In this passage, **the Lord** is still speaking of "**in that day**" when **He** will "<u>save</u>" **Judah** and "<u>defend</u>" **inhabitants of Jerusalem** and "<u>destroy</u>" **all the nations** that <u>come</u> against **Jerusalem**.

In Verse 6,

"In that day the Lord will make the (Leaders of the Clans) of Judah consume all the surrounding peoples, like a firepot or like a flaming torch consumes, while at the same time,

the **inhabitants of Jerusalem** again <u>dwell</u> on **their own** sites in **Jerusalem**.

In Verse 7,

"The LORD also "in that day" will save the tents of Judah first,

The people of the Tribe of Judah will be The Lord's highest or "first" priorityso that (Reason) the glory of the house of David and the glory of the inhabitants of Jerusalemwill not be magnified above the Tribe of Judah.ReadGen 49:10

In Verse 8,

"In that day the LORD will defend the inhabitants of Jerusalem,

and the one who is feeble among them in that day will be like David,

and the house of David will be like God, Read Jos 23:10

(house of David) like the angel of the LORD before them (inhabitants). Read Exodus 3:2 + Ex 13:21-22

In Verse 9,

"And **in that day I** (the LORD) **will** <u>set about</u> (seek) to <u>destroy</u> **all the nations** that <u>come</u> against Jerusalem. This is **the Lord's** intent (seek) to <u>destroy</u> **all the nations** and reaffirms what was said in Zech 12:3 **Read** Zech 12:3

In Zechariah 12, all the nations will Not Overcome or capture Jerusalem, that occurs in Zech 14:2

Read Paragraph > Zechariah 12:10–14

- C. In that day there will be great mourning in Jerusalem, over whom they pierced 12:10-14
 - 1. 10 "I (the LORD) will pour out on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem,
 - a. (pour out) The (A) **Spirit of grace** (unmerited favor) (Ezek 39:29, Joel 2:28-32, Acts 2:16-18)
 - b. and (pour out, Spirit) of supplication (mercy request), (Rom 11:25-27)
 - c. so that (Reason) they (inhabitants) will look on Me (Jesus)
 - i. whom they have pierced; (Isa 53:5, Jn 19:37, Rev 1:7)
 - d. and they (inhabitants) will mourn for Him (Jesus),i. as one mourns for an only son,
 - e. and they (inhabitants) will weep bitterly over Him (Jesus)
 - i. **like** the bitter <u>weeping</u> over a firstborn.
 - 2. 11 "In that day there will be great mourning in Jerusalem, (Matt 24:30, Rev 1:7)
 - a. like the mourning of Hadadrimmon in the plain of Megiddo (2 Kings 23:9, Rev 16:16).
 - 3. 12 "The land (of Israel) will mourn, every family by itself;
 - a. the family of the house of David by itself and their wives by themselves;
 - b. the **family** of **the house of Nathan** by **itself** and **their wives** by **themselves**;
 - c. 13 the family of the house of Levi by itself and their wives by themselves;
 - d. the **family** of the **Shimeites** (Levite) by **itself** and **their wives** by **themselves**;
 - e. 14 all the families that remain, every family by itself and their wives by themselves.

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 12:10–14

Second Oracle (Part 1), Future, The Lord's Concern for Jerusalem, in that day, 12:1-14

C. In that day there will be great mourning in Jerusalem, over whom they pierced 12:10–14¶

Q1a: In Verse 10, WHAT 2 Things with the Lord pour out, on house of David and inhabitants of Jerusalem ? A1a: (1) (pour out) The Spirit of grace (unmerited favor)

(2) (pour out, Spirit) of supplication (mercy request),

Read (Ezek 39:29 + Joel 2:28-32 + Acts 2:16-18)

Q1b: Therefore, WHAT is The **Spirit of grace** spoken of here, for **the inhabitants of Jerusalem** ? **A1b:** This **Spirit of grace** is when the **Holy Spirit** is <u>poured out</u> on **men** that leads to **their** being

regenerated as part of the application of the New Covenant, begun at Pentecost, Acts 2 Read Hebrews 8:6–13 (Other Ref: Heb 10:16-18) Read 1 Cor 2:10-14 + Zech 13:1

Q2: BUT, IF this is the New Covenant applied to Israel, then are they Not Saved at this point ? Read Rom 11:25-32 A1c: Yes, they are Saved

Q3: IF so, is this Not Part of the End of the **"partial hardening**" that "happened to Israel", in Rom 11:25 ? A3: Yes

Q4: Is this Not Part of "All Israel will being saved", in Rom 11:26 ? A4: Yes

Q5: Is this Not Part of when "He (the Lord) will <u>remove ungodliness</u> from Jacob (Israel) and "My Covenant with them (Israel)" "When I take away their Sins", in Rom 11:26-27 ?

A5: Yes

Q6: What is "the fulness of the Gentiles" and the "Mystery", in Rom 11:25?
A6a: "the fulness of the Gentiles" >

is when "the Time of the Gentiles" has come to an End.

God is now "taking from the Gentiles a people for Himself" (Acts 15:14). The Time of Israel ended when they rejected the Lord and were sent into Exile, in 605BC to 586BC. From that Time on the 4 Great Gentile Empires came in, Daniel 2 and Daniel 7 A6b: The "Mystery" >

In Scripture a "Mystery", is not a truth difficult to understand,

but a truth previously unrevealed (and therefore unknown) which is now revealed and publicly proclaimed The "Mystery" here is that a "partial hardening" that "happened to Israel", Rom 11:25

Q7: In Verses 11-14, WHY does "**every family**" "in Jerusalem" express **Great** <u>Mourning</u> ? <u>Mourning</u> Def: (<u>wailing</u> or expression of <u>sorrow</u> for <u>one</u> who has <u>Died</u>)

A7: Because they (inhabitants of Jerusalem) will look on Me (Jesus) whom they have pierced, 12:10 and realize that Jesus is the One whom they rejected that led to Him being pierced and killed.
 Read John 19:37 + Rev 1:7

This **Battle**, in Zechariah 12, is one of Many **Battles** or **Wars** with **the Gentile Nations**, leading up to **the Second Coming** or actual appearance of **Jesus**, when **He** comes with all the Holy Ones with Him, Zech 14:5b, Matt 16:27, Matt 25:31, Jude 14

In Zechariah 12,

In that day, "all the Nations", will be <u>gathered</u> <u>against</u> Jerusalem, to <u>siege</u> it with Armies. The Lord will intervene on behalf of Judah and Jerusalem and Strike the Nations Armies. This Not the Second Coming of Jesus, But a preliminary Attack on Jerusalem, Beforehand.

In Zechariah 14,

The Lord will gather all the nations against Jerusalem to Battle, and the city will be captured, the houses plundered, the women ravished, and half of the city exiled, Zech 14:2

Then **the LORD** will <u>go forth</u> and <u>fight</u> against **those nations**, as when **He** <u>fights</u> on **a day of battle**, Zech 14:3
