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PROPHECY IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

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OT Prophecy is > from the Lord, the source "the Lord said", Gen 12:1-3 and "I will", Gen 3:15
OT Prophecy is > Foreordained, the Lord "Declaring the End from the beginning", Isa 46:10
OT Prophecy is > according to the Lord's Plan, "I have planned it", Isa 46:10
OT Prophecy is > according to the Lord's Purpose. "My purpose will be established", Isa 46:10
OT Prophecy is > according to the Lord's good pleasure "all My good pleasure" or His will, Isa 46:10
OT Prophecy is > sure, Hosea 5:9, "I will bring it to pass", "I will do it", Isa 46:11
OT Prophecy is > Foretold, and revealed > ahead of time,
       the Lord "Declares the end from the beginning", Isa 46:10
       the Lord Declares "from ancient times things which have not been done", Isa 46:10
OT Prophecy is > Revealed first, by the Lord, to His Prophets. "Surely the Lord GOD does nothing
       Unless He reveals His secret counsel To His servants the prophets" Amos 3:7
OT Prophecy is > sometimes NOT Revealed in the OT, it is HIDDEN, But later revealed in the NT
       "....I WILL UTTER THINGS HIDDEN SINCE THE FOUNDATION OF THE WORLD", Matt 13:35
OT Prophecy is > Heard by the Prophets and written and Proclaimed by them.
OT Prophecy is > Fulfilled in the near future.
       Like Abraham, Given, Gen 17:15-17, Fulfilled, 21:2-3, Fulfilled a year later
       Like Joseph, Given, Gen 37:5-10, Fulfilled, Fulfilled about 13 years later
OT Prophecy is > Fulfilled further in the future,
       Like Daniel > (Nebuchadnezzar's Dream), Given, Dan 2:36-45,
              Fulfilled in 4 Kingdoms > Babylon, Medes-Persians, Greece, and Romans, 605BC to 476AD
       Like (70 year Exile), Fulfilled Dan 9:1-2, referring to Jerimiah's Prophecy, Given, Jer 25:11-12, 29:10
       Like Hosea, Israel's Captivity by Assyrians. Given, Hosea 5:9, Fulfilled, 2 Kings 17:5
OT Prophecy is > Fulfilled further in the future, in the New Testament, all in the Lord's Timing.
Now all this took place to Fulfill what was spoken by the Lord through the (OT) prophet, Matt 1:22
       OT Prophecies Fulfilled in Matthew> Matt 2:5, 2:15, 2:17, 2:23, 3:3, 4:14, 5:17, 8:17, 12:17, 12:39, 13:35,
       21:4, 22:40, 26:56, 27:9, (Fulfilled about 700 years later)
OT Prophecy is > Fulfilled in the far, far, future, But is Not Yet Fulfilled, But sure to be Fulfilled, Isa 46:11
       Like Hosea 3:4-5, Like Daniel 7 (4 Beasts), Dan 7:16-18, 23
OT Prophets > "the Lord has sent me (Jeremiah) to you to speak these words in your hearing", Jer 26:15
OT Prophets > are to be listened to >
       31 "But he (Abraham) said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses (Prophet) and the Prophets,
            they will not be persuaded even if someone rises from the dead." Luke 16:31
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OT Prophecy is > first revealed > often interpreted > then written and proclaimed > then fulfilled, all in the Lord's Timing.

OT Prophecy > is often **interpreted** in the **near context**, of a **Vision** or a **Dream**.

Read Dan 7:16-18, 23, Dan 8:19-22, Dan 9:22-27, Dan 10:14.
Daniel understood the Message and the Vision, Dan 10:1

Look for "What the Text Says" > Listen to "What the Lord said" to His prophets, He sent, Look for "What the prophets said", heard, understood, wrote down, and preached to Israel. First "What the prophets said" to Israel and Second "What the prophets said" to Us Gentiles.

 Q4: What does "they sow the wind, And they reap the whirlwind, 8:7, mean here?
         Q: How does one "sow the wind" or "reap the whirlwind"?
 A4: You can't do either one, it is in vain, having no practical effect or useful result. It is futile.
         This goes along with the standing grain that has no heads; It yields no grain. 8:7
                When you "sow the wind" or "reap the whirlwind" no crop or no heads
                   are on the standing grain or it the standing grain yields no grain.
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¹ Ephraim, gave Assyria, molded calf tribute (Hos 8:4-5, 10:5-6), so not destroy them, (2 Kings 15:19-20), but did in 722 BC

Questions of the Text: Hosea 8: 8-10

Israel has gone up among the nations and hired them as allies

Israel's search for help from the nations has been in vain.

"they <u>hired</u> allies among **the nations**", As a result > **they** become "**like a vessel**" which no one delights, "**like a wild donkey**" all alone, and **like** someone who "has <u>hired</u> **lovers**". 8:9

So No one wants them, they are all alone, they are like one who hires a prostitute, temporary fulfillment.

Therefore, "they (N. Israel) will begin to diminish" 8:10

"Because (Reason) of the burden of the king of princes". 8:10

"The burden" is probably the hiring fees Israel paid to Assyria for their protection. 8:10

Read Paragraph > Hosea 8: 11-14 Working Outline > Hosea 8: 11-14 XXV. Israel has altars for sin and sacrifice, and has forgotten his Maker, 8: 11-14¶ A. Since Ephraim (N. Israel) has multiplied altars for sin, 8:11 (Sin) 1. They have become altars of sinning for him (N. Israel). 8:11 B. Though I (the Lord) wrote for him (N. Israel) ten thousand (myriads) precepts of My law, 8:11 1. They (My precepts, Law) are regarded as a strange thing (alien). 8:12 (Sin) C. As for My (the Lord's) sacrificial gifts, They (N. Questions of the Text: Hosea 8: 11-14

Israel has altars for sin and sacrifice, and has forgotten his Maker

(N. Israel) has "multiplied **altars** for **sin"**, **they** "regarded as a strange thing (alien)" **the Lord's** "precepts" "**They** (N. Israel) sacrifice the flesh and eat it". 8:13 The **sacrifices** are nothing more than flesh, which **they** slay and eat, and <u>not</u> sacrifices in which **the Lord** takes delight.

Now **He** (the Lord) will <u>remember</u> their iniquity, 8:13 And <u>punish</u> them for their sins; 8:13 It is said, "Israel will return to Egypt", in Hos 8:13, Hos 9:3, and Deut 28:68. Some did after **70AD** But Hosea 11:5 says, "they will **not return** to Egypt, but Assyria will be their King".

What we know for sure is, that the **curses** of **Deut 28**, like **Deut 28:64-67**, will be put on **Israel** for **their** great **sin**.

Recause He (the Lord) will remember their iniquity. 8:13

Because He (the Lord) will <u>remember</u> their iniquity, 8:13 And <u>punish</u> them for their sins; 8:13

Deuteronomy 28:64 (Curses for Israel's disobedience, as said by Moses, in 1406BC) "Moreover, the Lord will scatter you (Israel, the Nation) among all peoples, from one end of the earth to the other end of the earth; and there you shall serve other gods, wood and stone, which you or your fathers have not known.

This Curse happen to both N. Israel and S. Judah, the entire Nation of Israel
