Why Study the Covenants in the Bible ?

Covenants as a Framework for a Biblical Theology

Or a way of looking for God's Overall Plan for Man through Covenant Promises

COVENANT Definition - Conclusion:

 COVENANT of GOD with MAN. A Promise of God, always initiated by God, between God and a Person or a People Group, according to His Plan, Purpose and Will.
 IF the Covenant specified certain binding conditions for God to fulfill both parties' obligations then it was considered a Unilateral or Un-Conditional Covenant.
 IF the Covenant specified certain binding conditions for God to fulfill, God's Part, and separate conditions for Man to fulfill, Man's Part, then it was considered a Bi-lateral or Conditional Covenant.

Change in Approach to the Study of Covenants

This Lesson we are changing from studying <u>what</u> a **Covenant** is and <u>what</u> different scholars over the centuries believe about the **Covenants** to actually studying the **Covenants** for ourselves. We will be starting in Genesis and working forward through the Old Testament and look how **they** are <u>Chronologically</u> and <u>Progressively Revealed</u> and how each <u>Covenant</u> builds or does not build on each previous <u>Covenant</u>. We will look at different locations in scripture that are considered <u>Covenants</u> by scholars and see if each location is an actual <u>Covenant</u> based on certain criteria, such as the **Definition** of a <u>Covenant</u> hereon.

First **God** Creates the **Heavens** and the **Earth**, Gen 1:1. Then **God** made **all living creatures** on the fifth and sixth days of **His** creation, including **Man**, Gen 1:20-27.

Read Genesis 1:26–28

26 Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness;

and let them <u>rule over</u> the fish of the sea and **over** the birds of the sky and over the cattle and (rule) **over** <u>all the **earth**</u>, and **over** every creeping thing that creeps on the **earth**." Ps 8:6

- 27 God <u>created man</u> in His own image, in the image of God He <u>created him</u>; male and female He <u>created them</u>.
- 28 God <u>blessed</u> them; and God said to them, "Be <u>fruitful</u> and <u>multiply</u>, and <u>fill</u> the <u>earth</u>, and <u>subdue</u> it; and <u>rule over</u> the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over every living thing that moves on the <u>earth</u>."

Q1: In verse 26-27, What 2 things did God (Elohim, Us God) make Man "according to"? A1:

Q3: In verse 28, What 4 things or actions is Man to "Be" and Do, according to God ?

A3: (1) <u>Be</u> fruitful and multiply, (2) <u>fill</u> the <u>earth</u>, (3) <u>subdue</u> it (earth); and (4) <u>rule over</u> all creatures on it. These things are <u>mandated</u> by <u>God</u> to <u>Man</u>, according to <u>God's Purpose</u> and <u>Will</u>.

Man is to **subdue** (bring into submission) and <u>rule **over**</u> (to exercise authority over) the **Earth**. Man is to <u>rule **over**</u> all the <u>earth</u> as in a "Theocratic Kingdom"

The Rule of God, through a divinely chosen representative (man),
who speaks and acts for God.Alva McClain, The Greatness of the KingdomA Kingdom > always has a King, a Land, and a People

COVENANT OF GOD WITH ADAM - GIVEN

Genesis 2:15–17 is commonly considered a Covenant of God. Read Hosea 6:6-7

Working Outline > Genesis 2:15–17 (a portion of, a Paragraph ¶ from NAS Bible), Gen 2:10-17 Read Genesis 2:15–17

- I. 15 Then the Lord (yhwh) God (elohim) took the man
 - A. and <u>put</u> him into the garden of Eden
 - 1. to cultivate it and keep it.
 - B. 16 The Lord God <u>commanded</u> (authoritatively ordered) the man, saying,
 - 1. "From any tree of the garden (with, the tree of Life, 2:9) you may <u>eat</u> freely;
 - C. 17 but (exception) from the tree of the knowledge (for knowing) of good and evil
 1. you shall not eat,
 - D. for (Reason) in the day that you eat from it
 - 1. you will surely die."

A11: Yes, God's Commands imply that He is obligated by His word to follow through, as in a Promise. Promise: "a declaration that <u>one will do or refrain from doing</u> something specified" Websters

Q13: Is this Adamic Covenant a Conditional or Un-Conditional Covenant? A13:
Q14: Do these verses qualify as, a stand alone Major Covenant, as many Commentators say?
A14: Well, these verses do reveal some aspects of a Major Covenant.
Like, this being a Promise of God, as seen through His Command

Like, being <u>initiated</u> by **God**

Like, a <u>Condition</u> for Man to fulfill

Like, <u>implied</u> Cursing for <u>disobedience</u>, though in a Blessed state, as in you will surely Die. Like, being called a Covenant in Hos 6:6-7

But it seems best to consider the Bigger Picture of Gen 2:15 – Gen 3:24 This means that to confirm the Adamic Covenant as a Covenant you need to understand all that occurred, between Gen 2:15 – Gen 3:24. There we will see more about the actual <u>disobeying</u>, the Fall from Blessing of God, the Cursing, the Tree of good and evil, the Tree of Life, and the Serpents Role in the events etc...



COVENANT OF GOD WITH ADAM - BROKEN

Working Outline > Genesis 3:1–7 (a Paragraph ¶ from NAS Bible), Read Genesis 3:1–7

- I. 1 Now the serpent was more crafty than any beast of the field (Rev 12:9) A. which the Lord God had made.
 - B. And he said to the woman, "Indeed, has God said, (Serpent's Doubt)
 1. 'You shall not eat from any tree of the garden' ?"
- **II. 2** The woman said to the **serpent**, (Woman's Response)
 - A. "From the fruit of the trees of the garden we may eat;
 - B. 3 but from the fruit of the tree (of Good and Evil) which is in the middle of the garden,
 - C. God has said, 'You shall not eat from it or touch it, or you will die.' "
- **III. 4** The **serpent** said to the **woman**, **"You** surely will <u>not **die**</u>! (**Serpent's** Lie, Deception, & Temptation)
 - A. 5 "For God knows that in the day you eat from it
 - 1. your eyes will be opened,
 - 2. and you will be like God,
 - a. knowing good and evil." (like Tree name)
- IV. 6 When the woman saw that (Woman Contemplates Lie and Her fleshly Desires) 2 Cor 11:3
 - A. the tree was good for food, (desirable to mouth)
 - B. and that it was a <u>delight to the eyes</u>, (desirable to eyes)
 - C. and that the tree was desirable to make one wise, (desirable knowledge, Like God's)
- V. she took from its fruit and ate; (Woman gives in to, Lie and Her fleshly Desires, Deceived) Gen 3:13
 A. and she gave (fruit) also to her husband with her, (Woman shares Her Deception) Gen 3:12
 1. and he (Adam) ate. (Adam Not Deceived, 1 Tim 2:14, But Adam listened to Woman, Gen 3:17)
- VI. 7 Then the eyes (mind's eyes) of both of them were opened,
 - A. and they knew that they were naked (exposed, ashamed, afraid); Gen 2:25, Gen 3:10, Isa 47:3
 - B. and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loin coverings. (covered or hid shame)

Q1: What does this have to do with **God's Covenant** with **Adam**, in Gen 3:15-17 ? A1: In Gen 2:15-17, the **Covenant** is **Given** and here in Gen 3:1-7, the **Covenant** is **Broken**.

COVENANT OF GOD WITH ADAM - TRIAL

Read Genesis 3:8–13

- **I. 8** They heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day,
 - A. and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God1. among the trees of the garden.
- II. 9 Then the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?"
- III. 10 He said, "I heard the sound of You in the garden,
 - A. and I was <u>afraid</u> because I was naked (feeling guilty, disgraced, or ashamed); Read Gen 2:25
 1. so I hid myself." (shame, guilt often drives one to hide or deny act or defer blame) Ezra 9:6
- IV. 11 And He said, "Who told you that you were naked ?
 - A. Have you eaten from the tree
 - 1. of which I commanded you not to eat ?" (the Covenant reminder, Gen 2:15-17)
- V. 12 The man said, "The woman whom You gave to be with me, (deferred Blame)
 - A. she gave me from the tree, and I ate." (did not take from tree himself)
- VI. 13 Then the Lord God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?"
 - A. And the woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate." (deferred Blame)

Q1: What does this have to do with **God's Covenant** with **Adam**, in Gen 2:15-17 and Gen 3:1-7 ? **A1:** In Gen 2:15-17 the **Covenant** is **Given**, in Gen 3:1-7 the **Covenant** is **Broken**,

and here in Gen 3:8-13 is the Covenant Breakers Trial, with Questioning and Excuses



COVENANT OF GOD WITH ADAM — SENTENCING OF THE WOMAN THE CURSE OF THE WOMAN — FOR BREAKING COVENANT Read Genesis 3:16

I. 16 To the woman He said,

- A. "I will greatly multiply your pain in childbirth,
- B. In pain you will bring forth children;
- C. Yet (No Yet, in Hebrew) your desire will be for your husband,
 - 1. And he will <u>rule **over**</u> you."

Notice:

Woman Not Blamed for Listening to Serpent or for being an accessory to Adam's eating.

COVENANT OF GOD WITH ADAM — SENTENCING OF THE MAN THE CURSE OF THE MAN — FOR BREAKING COVENANT Read Genesis 3:17–19

- I. 17 Then to Adam He said,
 - A. "Because (Reason) you have listened to the voice of your wife,
 - B. and have <u>eaten</u> from the tree about which I commanded you,
 - 1. saying, 'You shall not eat from it'; (the Covenant reminder, Gen 2:15-17)
 - 2. Cursed is the ground because (Reason) of you;
 - 3. In **toil you** will <u>eat</u> of **it**
 - a. All the days of your life.
 - 4. 18 "Both thorns and thistles it shall grow for you;
 - 5. And you will eat the plants of the field;
 - 6. 19 By the sweat of your face You will eat bread,
 - a. Till (until) you return to the ground, (surely dying) (Covenant stipulation, Gen 2:17)
 - 7. Because (Reason) from it you were taken;
 - a. For you are dust, And to dust you shall return." (assumes the grave & death)

Q1: What is the **Reason** given by **God** for **Cursing Adam,** in verse 17 ? A1:

Basically Adam did Not Trust in what God had said, But Trusted in what his wife's said.

Q2: What is the Key Thing Cursed by God, relating to Adam ? A2:

Q3: What does this have to do with God's Covenant with Adam, in Gen 2:15-17 and Gen 3:1-7 ? A3: In Gen 2:15-17 the Covenant is Given, in Gen 3:1-7 the Covenant is Broken, in Gen 3:8-13 is the Covenant Breakers Trial, and here in Gen 3:16-19 is the Covenant Breakers Sentencing.

COVENANT OF GOD WITH ADAM — SENTENCING OF THE ACCOMPLICE THE CURSE OF THE SERPENT — FOR DECEIVING WOMAN Read Genesis 3:14–15

I. 14 The Lord God said to the serpent (Satan, Rev 12:9),

1. "Because (Reason) you have done this (Deceiving and Lying),

B. Cursed are you [Curse: divine power, inflicts harm or punishment on another]

1. (Cursed) more than all cattle, (cattle Cursed)

- 2. And (Cursed) more than every beast of the field; (every beast Cursed)
- C. On **your** belly **you** will go,
 - 1. And dust you will eat, (brought low, humiliated) Mic 7:17, Isa 65:25
 - a. All the days of **your** life;
- II. 15 And I will put enmity (hostility) Between you (Satan) and the woman,

A. And (enmity) between your seed (descendants) and her seed (descendant); Matt 13:24-30, 34-35

1. He (woman's seed, descendant) shall bruise (crush) you (Satan) on the head, Rom 16:20

2. And you (Satan) shall bruise him (woman's seed, descendant) on the heel."

Q1: What does verse 14, have to do with God's Covenant with Adam, in Gen 2:15-17 and Gen 3:1-7 ? A1: the serpent, got between God and His Covenant with Man and usurped God, without the legal right.

The Covenant was Not with the serpent, But between God and Man, it was none of his business ! God Tested or Tried Man to <u>Not Eat</u>, to see if he would <u>trust</u> and <u>obey Him</u>, or His Covenant. God Tested Man's Faith, Jam 1:3, because "Blessed is the man that <u>perseveres</u> under Trial", Jam 1:12.

Later we will see how **God Tested Abraham's Faith**, Gen 22:1-2, concerning Isaac,

and how God Tested the Sons of Israel Faith, Ex 20:20, with His Ten Commandments.

The US God, wanted Man to Rule the Earth, Gen 1:26, the serpent didn't want Man to Rule the Earth. The serpent wanted Man to Fail in his God given Role as a Ruler of the Earth.

Q2: So WHY was Serpent Cursed ?

A2: the Serpent, was Cursed for:

Deceiving the Woman that led to Her and the Man breaking God's Covenant with them, in Gen 2:15-17.

In verse 15a, God put enmity (hostility) Between Satan and the woman. This Leads to thousands of years of <u>hostility</u> (enmity) of Satan toward the Woman, Gen 3:15a, Rev 12:17 In verse 15b, God put enmity between Satan's seed (descendants, plural) and the woman's seed (descendant, singular).

This Leads to <u>hostility</u> (enmity) of <u>Satan</u> toward "her seed", the Woman's seed (descendants, plural) and to the Woman's seed (descendant, singular)

Q3: Who <u>are</u> the Woman's seed (descendants, plural)?

A3: the Woman's seed (descendants, plural) are all those future Offspring of the Woman. They are all those future Offspring-Descendants or children that Women will Bear in the future.

Q4: Who <u>is</u> a Woman's seed (descendant, singular)?

A4: the Woman's **seed** (descendant, singular) is the future **Offspring** of the Woman.

The future Offspring-Descendant or child that a Woman will Bear in the future.

Q5: Does Gen 3:15 tell us <u>Who</u> this Woman's seed (descendant, singular) child is, or <u>Who</u> the Woman ?
 A5: No, it only tells us <u>What</u> this child will do to Satan, specifically that future child will, bruise Satan's head. it also says, that he, Satan, will bruise that future child on the heal.

Q6: But don't we know many, many more things about this Woman's seed (descendant, singular) child ?
 A6: We know, only What is revealed to Satan, overheard by Adam, and described by Moses, so far, in Genesis 3:15.

Q7: But don't we know about this **Woman's seed** (descendant, singular) **child**, from the rest of the Bible ? **A7:** Yes, We know many things as **Progressively Revealed** as said on Page 1 of this Lesson. "We will be starting in Genesis and working forward through the Old Testament and look how **they**

are <u>Chronologically</u> and <u>Progressively</u> <u>Revealed</u> and how each <u>Covenant</u> builds or does not build on each previous <u>Covenant</u>."

Q8: But can't we know <u>Who</u> this Woman's seed (descendant, singular) child, from the rest of the Bible ? **A8:** Yes, **First** we know, the Woman's seed (descendant) will <u>crush</u> Satan, Gen 3:15b

Second we know, the <u>75 Descendants</u> of the Woman (Eve), from Adam to Jesus, Luke 3:23-38 Luke 3 is Eve's Descendants (descendants, plural), the 75 Generations from Adam to Mary. We know that Mary's offspring (descendant, singular), was born of a Woman, Born by the Holy Spirit and Power of God, Holy offspring shall be called the Son of God, Read Lk 1:35 Mary's offspring ("seed of the woman") through Eve, in her womb, was to be Named Jesus, Luke 1:31

Q9: What does this have to do with **God's Covenant** with **Adam**, in Gen 2:15-17 and Gen 3:1-7 ? **A9:** In Gen 2:15-17, the **Covenant** is **Given**, in Gen 3:1-7, the **Covenant** is **Broken**, in Gen 3:8-13, is the **Covenant Breakers Trial**, in Gen 3:16-19, is the **Covenant Breakers Sentencing**, and here in Gen 3:14–15, is the **Covenant Breakers Accomplice Sentencing**. (See Chart, on last page)

THE REFORMED THEOLOGY (COVENANT THEOLOGY) VIEW

Gen 3:15 is consider a Major Covenant, by Reformed Theology (Covenant Theology) Scholars. Gen 3:15 is consistently Called the "Covenant of Grace" in the Westminster Confession, Chapter 7 and in the 2nd London Confession, Chapter 7.

Reformed Theology says this One verse Gen 3:15, is the **Overarching-Covenant** in the Bible, with other **Subordinate-Covenants** mentioned throughout the rest of the Old Testament.

The Word "Grace" is Not <u>mentioned</u> in Gen 3:15, But it is <u>implied</u> though Not plainly expressed. IF we understand "Grace" to mean the God's Grace, as in "by Grace (of God) you are saved", Eph 2:8 Then the "Grace of God" is <u>implied</u> in this Gen 3:15, <u>But</u> Not expressed.

as in Gen 3:15b, "He (woman's seed, descendant) shall bruise (crush) you (Satan) on the head" God will "Graciously" Crush Satan, by the Woman's seed (descendant, singular) child.

Even though this is the First revelation of God's Grace in Scripture,

there are <u>many places</u> in the Bible that reveal a Gracious God.

Therefore, At this Time, about 4000 BC

Adam now knew very little about the woman's descendant ? But following Adam God Progressively Reveals more and more about the woman's descendant.
