Our Approach to the Study of Covenants

We are studying the **Covenants** for ourselves. [Not adopting an existing Theology on Covenants]
We are starting in Genesis and working forward through the Old Testament to understand
how they are **Chronologically** and **Progressively Revealed** and how each **Covenant** builds on
or does not build on each previous **Covenant**.

The **COVENANT Definition – Update One**

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COVENANT Definition: Update One

COVENANT of GOD. A Promise of God, always initiated and established by God, Gen 6:18, 9:9, 11, 17

between God and a Person, a People Group, or all Living things, Gen 9:10, Gen 9:17,

according to His Plan, Purpose and Will.

COVENANT of GOD. as "Promises", often with "I will" or "I shall" statements, that "will come to pass".

IF the Covenant specified certain binding conditions for God to fulfill both parties' obligations then it was considered a Unilateral or Un-Conditional Covenant.

IF the Covenant specified certain binding conditions for God to fulfill, God's Part, and separate conditions for Man to fulfill, Man's Part,

then it was considered a Bi-lateral or Conditional Covenant.

COVENANT of GOD, often has offered burnt (killed) offerings, Gen 8:20, Gen 22:2, Rom 8:3

COVENANT of GOD, often has "a sign" to "remember" or to identify with, that Covenant, Gen 9:12

COVENANT of GOD, is often identified as an "everlasting covenant", Gen 9:16, Gen 17:7, Jer 32:40

The Passover Feast Celebration requirements given, as a Permanent Ordinance, Ex 12:1-14
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The Passover Feast Celebration requirements given, as a Permanent Ordinance, Ex 12:1-14 On First Month of the year (later called Nisan, Mar-April), Ex 12:2 (10th of Month) take an unblemished male Lamb for each household, Ex 12:3 (14th of Month) kill the unblemished male Lamb, at twilight, Ex 12:6 Put some of the Blood, with hyssop, 12:22, on the door posts and door lintels, Ex 12:7, 12:22 eat the flesh of Lamb that same night, roasted with fire, Ex 12:8 eat Lamb with unleavened bread and bitter herbs, Ex 12:8 Not leave any of Lamb left over until morning, but if left over burn with fire, Ex 12:9 eat Lamb in this manner: Ex 12:11 with your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand, Ex 12:11 and you shall eat Lamb in haste—the Lamb is the LORD'S Passover, Ex 12:11 Now this day will be a memorial to you, Ex 12:11 you shall celebrate it as a feast to the LORD, Ex 12:11 throughout your generations as a permanent ordinance, Ex 12:14

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the Feast of Unleavened Bread requirements given, as a Permanent Ordinance, Ex 12:15-20 on 1<sup>st</sup> day of 7 days (15<sup>th</sup> of Month) you shall eat unleavened bread, Ex 12:8 you shall remove leaven from your houses, Ex 12:15, cut off from Israel, if disobey, Ex 12:15 you shall have a holy assembly, Ex 12:16, No Work done, Ex 12:16 you shall present an offering by fire, Lev 23:8, on 2<sup>nd</sup> day through 6<sup>th</sup> day (16<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> of Month) 5 days you shall eat unleavened bread, Ex 12:8, present an offering by fire, Lev 23:8
On 7<sup>th</sup> day (21<sup>st</sup> of Month) you shall eat unleavened bread, Ex 12:8, present an offering by fire, Lev 23:8 you shall have a holy assembly, Ex 12:16, No Work done, Ex 12:16
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Notice: The 2 Feasts were given before the 10<sup>th</sup> Plague that killed all first born of Egypt, in Ex 12:29
Q1: In Exodus 12:11, what are the 4 requirements given to eat the Lamb?
A2: (1) with your loins girded (2) your sandals on feet (3) your staff in hand (4) eat Lamb in haste
Q2: Can you see any Reason for the Lord wanting Israel to be dressed and eat in haste? See Ex 12:12
A2: They dressed to be ready to be sent out of Egypt in haste, on that night, 12:8, 12, 33, 34, 39, 42
By knowing that the Passover was on First Month of the year, Nisan, on the 14<sup>th</sup> of Month.
       and knowing that the Passover was done the same night as the 10th Plague, to kill sons,
       and knowing that the same night of the Plague, Pharaoh, at night, told Moses to Go, 12:30-32, 42
That means the Exodus of Egypt, was on First Month of the year, Nisan, Mar-April, on the 14<sup>th</sup> of Month.
Also if Solomon Began his reign in 970BC, Edwin Thiele, and 1 Kings 6:1 says that, in the 4th year of his
reign (970 - 4 = 966) is 966BC, 480 years after Israel left Egypt, then (966 + 480) = 1446BC for Exodus.
The 10<sup>th</sup> Plague that killed all the first born of Egypt, at midnight, Ex 12:29–36
Exodus 12:29-36
29 Now it came about at midnight (11:4)
    that the Lord struck all the firstborn (Num 33:4) in the land of Egypt,
    from the firstborn of Pharaoh who sat on his throne
    to the firstborn of the captive who was in the dungeon, and all the firstborn of cattle. (Ps 135:8)
30 Pharaoh arose in the night, he and all his servants and all the Egyptians,
    and there was a great cry in Egypt (11:6), for there was no home where there was not someone dead.
31 Then he called for Moses and Aaron at night and said,
    "Rise up, get out from among my people, both you and the sons of Israel;
         and go, worship the Lord, as you have said. (10:9, 11:1)
32 "Take both your flocks and your herds, as you have said (10:9, 26), and go, and bless me also."
33 The Egyptians urged the people, to send them out of the land in haste,
    for they said, "We will all be dead."
34 So the people took their dough before it was leavened, (unleavened bread)
       with their kneading bowls bound up in the clothes on their shoulders.
35 Now the sons of Israel had done according to the word of Moses,
    for they had requested from the Egyptians articles of silver and articles of gold, and clothing; (3:21)
36 and the Lord had given the people favor in the sight of the Egyptians,
    so that they let them have their request. Thus they plundered the Egyptians. (3:21-22, 11:2-3)
The sons of Israel journey from Rameses to Succoth, on edge of Wilderness, Ex 12:37–39
    on the (15<sup>th</sup> day of the 1<sup>st</sup> Month, of Nisan) the day after Passover, (Num 33:3)
Exodus 12:37-39
37 Now the sons of Israel journeyed from Rameses to Succoth, Ex 13:20, Num 33:3-6
    about six hundred thousand men on foot, aside from children. Ex 38:26, Num 2:32
38 A mixed multitude (Non-Israelites) also went up with them,
    along with flocks and herds, a very large number of livestock.
39 They baked the dough which they had brought out of Egypt into cakes of unleavened bread.
    For it had not become leavened, since they were driven out of Egypt and could not delay, 12:34
        nor had they prepared any provisions for themselves.
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Notice: If 600,000 men + 600,000 men + 600,000 children + a "mixed multitude" of people, then easily there were at least 2 Million People who left Egypt.

Also, Israel took all their own flocks and herds, 12:32, and articles of silver and gold, and clothing, 12:35 Israel left with great wealth as well as their freedom.

This similar to what happened to Abraham and Pharaoh back in Gen 12:10-20

After 430 Years, Israel Left Egypt, at Night, Ex 12:40–42

Exodus 12:40-42

40 Now the time that the sons of Israel lived in Egypt was four hundred and thirty years.

41 And at the end of four hundred and thirty years, to the very day,

all the hosts of the Lord went out from the land of Egypt.

42 It is a night to be <u>observed</u> for the Lord for having brought them out from the land of Egypt; this night is for the Lord, to be <u>observed</u> by all the sons of Israel throughout their generations.

Notice: What **Exodus 12:40** says in these different Bible Versions, and the commas added.

Exodus 12:40 (NASB95, Masoretic)

"Now the time that the sons of Israel lived in Egypt was four hundred and thirty years".

Exodus 12:40 (KJV 1900, Masoretic)

"Now the sojourning of the children of Israel, who dwelt in Egypt, was four hundred and thirty years.

Exodus 12:40 (The NETS 2007, Septuagint)

And the sojourning of the children of Israel,

while they sojourned in the land of Egypt and the land of Chanaan, was four hundred and thirty years.

Q1: Did Israel <u>live</u> in Egypt for 430 years OR Did <u>Israel</u> <u>sojourn</u> (in lands not theirs) for 430 years OR Did <u>Israel</u> <u>sojourn</u> in <u>Egypt</u> and <u>Canaan</u> for 430 years?


A1: I think Israel sojourn in Egypt and Canaan for 430 years for a few reasons.

Reason One:

Referring to the 4th Generation coming out of Egypt, Gen 15:16, as Moses

1st Generation: Levi 2nd Generation: Kohath 3rd Generation: Amram 4th Generation: Moses

Doesn't give enough Generations to fill up 430 years?

The Lord came down on Mount Sinai and spoke to Moses and the People, in Thunder Read Exodus 19:16–25

 - B. and a thick cloud upon the mountain and a very loud trumpet sound,

 - B. 21 Then The Lord spoke to Moses, "Go down, warn the people,
 - 1. so that they do not break through to The Lord to gaze, and many of them perish. Ex 3:5
 - C. 22 "Also let the priests who come near to The Lord consecrate themselves,
 - 1. or else The Lord will break out against them."
- IV. 23 Moses said to The Lord, "The people cannot come up to Mount Sinai, for You warned us, saying,

Mount Sinai was all in smoke and fire and quaked violently Read Gen 15:17, Judges 5:5, Ps 68:8

The Lord came down to the

top of the mountain; Read Neh 9:13 the sound of the trumpet

grew louder and louder

Moses spoke and God answered him with thunder.

The Lord came down to

GOD'S COVENANT WITH THE SONS OF ISRAEL AT MOUNT SINAI

Working Outline > Exodus 20:18-21 (Paragraphs ¶ from NAS Bible)

The Lord has come to Test you, in order that, you Fear Him and Not Sin Exodus 20:18–21

- I. 18 All the people perceived
 - A. the thunder and lightning... the sound of the trumpet and the mountain smoking;
 - B. and when the people saw it, they trembled and stood at a distance. Deut 5:5
- II. 19 Then they said to Moses, "Speak to us yourself (mediate) and we will listen; Deut 5:27
 - A. but let not God speak to us, or we will die." Deut 5:23-27, Heb 12:19
- III. 20 Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid;
 - A. for (Reason) God has come in order to test you, Deut 13:3, 16:4-9, 17:1-7
 - B. and in order that (Reason) the fear of Him may remain with you, Deut 6:2, Deut 4:10
 - C. so that (Reason) you may not sin."
- IV. 21 So the people stood at a distance,
 - A. while Moses approached the thick cloud where God was.

Notice: How the people don't want God to speak to them, for fear of dying, 20:19
Instead they want Moses to speak for them to God, as a Mediator would do, 20:19
But Moses tells the people, to Not be afraid of God, 20:20

Notice: also, the <u>Commands of the Covenant</u> were given to <u>Test</u> the people to Fear God.

Read Galatians 3:19

19 Why the Law then? It (the Law) was added because of transgressions,

(the Law) having been <u>ordained</u> through <u>angels</u> by <u>the agency of</u> a <u>mediator</u> (Moses), <u>until</u> the seed (of the woman, Gen 3:15) would come

to whom (the seed of the woman) the promise had been made (about).

Q4: In verse 20, What is the Reason God wants the people, to Fear Him?

The Recounting, Agreeing, Writing, and Ratifying in Blood of the Covenant:

The People Promise to do the Commands and Ordinances of the Covenant, Ex 24:3, Deut 5:27, 26:17

Moses writes down all the words of the Covenant, Ex 24:4

Moses builds an altar, with 12 pillars, for the 12 tribes of Israel, Ex 24:4

Young Men, offer burnt offerings and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings, Ex 24:5, Lev 1:3, 13, 17

Moses puts half the blood (of bulls) in basins, and the other half he sprinkled on the altar, Ex 24:6, Lev 1:5, 11

Moses took the book of the covenant and read it in the hearing of the people, Ex 24:7

The People say, "All that the Lord has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient!", Ex 24:7, 19:8, 24:3

Moses took the blood (of basins) and sprinkled it on the people, Ex 24:8, Heb 9:18-22

says, "Behold the blood of the covenant, the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words."

Disobeying the Covenant, Ex 32:1-6

All the people Corrupt themselves, by worshiping idols, and the Lord is angry, Ex 32:7-10

Moses intercedes for the people, by entreating the Lord, Ex 32:1-6

Renewing the Covenant with the people, Ex 34:1-28
