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## Working Outline of Zechariah (Paragraphs ¶ from NAS Bible) I. The word of the Lord came to Zechariah the Prophet, 1:1-6 ¶(Oct-Nov) (520BC), A. 1 In the eighth month (Oct-Nov) of the second year of (Persian King) Darius (I) (520BC), 1:1 1. the word of the Lord came to Zechariah the prophet, 1:1 2. the son of **Berechiah** (father), the son of **Iddo** (grandfather, Priest) saying, 1:1 B. The Call for Israel to Repent and Return to the Lord, do not be like your fathers, 1:2-5 1. 2 "The Lord was very angry (wrathful) with your fathers (Israel's). 1:2 2. 3 "Therefore (because of that) say to them, 'Thus says the Lord of hosts, 1:3 a. "Return (turn back) to Me," declares the Lord of hosts, i. "that I may return (turn back) to you," says the Lord of hosts. 3. 4 "Do not be like your (Israel's) fathers, to whom the former prophets proclaimed, saying, 1:4 4. 'Thus says the Lord of hosts, "Return now from your evil ways and from your evil deeds."' a. But they (your fathers) did not listen or give heed to Me," declares the Lord. 5. 5 "Your fathers, where are they? 1:5 6. And the prophets, do they live forever? 1:5 C. Did not My words and Statutes overtake your fathers? 1:6 1. 6 "But did not My words and My statutes, 1:6 a. which I commanded My servants the prophets, overtake your fathers? 1:6 2. Then they (your fathers) repented (turned) and said, 1:6 a. 'As the Lord of hosts purposed to do to us, 1:6 i. in accordance with our ways and our deeds, so He has dealt with us. 1:6 II. The word of the Lord came to Zechariah the Prophet, 1:7-11¶ (Feb 15<sup>th</sup>) (519BC) (at Night) A. 7 On the twenty-fourth day of the eleventh month, 1. which is the month Shebat, in the second year of Darius (I), B. the word of the Lord came to Zechariah the prophet, 1:7 1. the son of Berechiah, the son of Iddo, 1:7 2. as follows: C. 8 I (Zechariah) saw (Vision) at night, 1:8 1. and behold, a man was riding on a red horse, 1:8 2. and he (a man on red horse) was standing among the myrtle trees 1:8 a. which were in the ravine, 1:8 3. with red (horses), sorrel (red brown, horses) and white horses behind him (a man). 1:8 D. 9 Then I (Zechariah) said, "My lord, what are these (horses/rider)?" 1:9 1. And the angel who was speaking with me said to me, 1:9 2. "I (the angel) will show you what these (horses/riders) are." 1:9 E. 10 And the man who was standing among the myrtle trees answered and said, 1:10a 1. "These (horses/riders) are those whom the Lord has sent to patrol the earth." 1:10b 2. 11 So they (horses/riders) answered the angel of the Lord 1:11a a. who (the angel of the Lord) was standing among the myrtle trees and said, 1:11b 3. "We (horses/riders) have patrolled the earth, 1:11c a. and behold, all the earth is peaceful and quiet." 1:11d III. the angel of the LORD to the LORD of hosts how long will You, 1:12-17¶

1. how long will You (the Father) have no compassion for Jerusalem and the cities of Judah, 2. with which You (the Father) have been indignant these seventy years, 7:5?"

A. 12 Then the angel of the LORD (Jesus) said, "O LORD of hosts (the Father),

B. 13 The LORD (the Father) answered the angel (of the Lord, Jesus) who was speaking with me

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1. with gracious words, comforting words.
     C. 14 So the angel (of the Lord, Jesus) who was speaking with me said to me,
         1. "Proclaim, saying, 'Thus says the LORD of hosts (the Father),
         2. "I am (the Father) exceedingly jealous for Jerusalem and Zion.
     D. 15 "But I am (the Father) very angry with the nations who are at ease;
         1. for (Reason) while I was only a little angry, they (the nations) furthered the disaster."
     E. 16 'Therefore (because of that) thus says the LORD (the Father),
         1. "I will (the Father) return to Jerusalem with compassion;
         2. My house (Temple) will be built in it (Jerusalem)," declares the LORD of hosts,
         3. "and a measuring line will be stretched over Jerusalem." '
     F. 17 "Again, proclaim, saying, 'Thus says the LORD of hosts (the Father),
         1. "My cities will again overflow with prosperity,
         and the LORD will again comfort Zion and again choose Jerusalem." "
IV. Four Horns which scattered Judah, Israel and Jerusalem." 1:18–21¶ (Feb 15<sup>th</sup>) (519BC) (Night)
     A. 18 Then I (Zechariah) lifted up my eyes and looked, and behold, there were four horns.
         1. 19 So I (Zechariah) said to the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me,
         2. "What are these (four horns) (Nations)?"
         3. And he (Jesus) answered me,
         4. "These (4) are the horns (Nations) which have scattered Judah, Israel and Jerusalem."
     B. 20 Then the LORD showed me (Zechariah) four craftsmen.
         1. 21 (Zechariah) said, "What are these (four craftsmen) coming to do?"
         2. And he (Jesus) said,
         3. "These (four horns) are the horns (Nations) which have scattered Judah
             a. so that no man lifts up his head;
         4. but these (4) craftsmen have come to terrify them (4 horns) (4 Nations),
             a. to throw down the horns (Kings) of the nations
             b. who (Kings) have lifted up their horns (Kings) (Nations) against the land of Judah
             c. in order to (Reason) scatter it (the land of Judah)."
V. A Man with a measuring line (Surveyor) to measure Jerusalem, 2:1-5 (Feb 15th) (519BC) (at Night)
     A. 1 Then I (Zechariah) lifted up my eyes and looked, and behold,
     B. there was a man with a measuring line in his hand. (Surveyors: measure boundaries)
         1. 2 So I (Zechariah) said, "Where are you (the man) going?"
         2. And he (the man) said to me (Zechariah),
         3. "To measure Jerusalem, to see how wide it is and how long it is." (See 1:16)
         4. 3 And behold, the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me (Zech) was going out, (See 1:9)
             a. and another angel was coming out to meet him (Jesus),
         5. 4 and (Jesus) said to him (another angel), "Run, speak to that young man (Zechariah), saying,
         6. 'Jerusalem will be inhabited without walls (unprotected)
              a. (Reason) because of the multitude of men and cattle within it (Jerusalem).
         7. 5 'For I (Jesus),' declares the Lord (the Father),
             a. 'will be a wall of fire around her (Jerusalem's),
             b. and I (Jesus) will be the glory in her (Jerusalem's) midst."
VI. Flee and Escape the land of the north, you People of Zion, 2:6–12 ¶
    A. 6 "Ho there! (You) Flee from the land of the north," declares the Lord,
         1. "for (Reason) I have dispersed you (of Zion) as the four winds of the heavens,"
             a. declares the Lord.
     B. 7 "Ho, Zion! Escape, you (of Zion) who are living with the daughter of Babylon."
         1. 8 For (Reason) thus says the Lord of hosts (the Father),
             a. "After glory He (the Father) has sent Me (Jesus)
             b. against the nations which plunder you (Jerusalem),
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c. for he (of Nations) who touches you (of Zion),
                    i. touches the apple of His (the Father's) eye.
      C. 9 "For (Reason) behold, I (Jesus) will wave My hand over them (Nations)
           1. so that (Reason) they (Nations) will be plunder for their (Nations) slaves.
           2. Then you (of Zion) will know that the Lord of hosts has sent Me (Jesus).
      D. 10 "Sing for joy and be glad, O daughter of Zion;
           1. for (Reason) behold I (Jesus) am coming and I (Jesus) will dwell in your (of Zion) midst,"
           2. declares the Lord.
      E. 11 "Many nations will join themselves to the Lord (Jesus) in that day
           1. and (those nations) will become My (Jesus') people.
      F. Then I (Jesus) will dwell in your (Jesus' peoples') midst,
           1. and you (Jesus' peoples') will know that the Lord of hosts (the Father)
               a. has sent Me (Jesus) to you.
      G. 12 "The Lord will possess Judah as His portion in the holy land,
           1. and (the Lord) will again choose Jerusalem.
VII. Be silent, all flesh, before the Lord for He is aroused from His holy habitation, 2:13¶
      A. 13 "Be silent, all flesh, before the Lord;
           1. for (Reason) He is aroused from His holy habitation."
VIII. Joshua the high priest Cleansed before the angel of the Lord (Jesus), 3:1–5 ¶ (Feb 15<sup>th</sup>) (519BC) (at Night)
      A. 1 Then he (Jesus) showed me (Zechariah) Joshua the high priest
           1. (Joshua) standing before the angel of the Lord (Jesus),
           2. and Satan standing at his (Joshua's) right hand
               a. to accuse him (Joshua). (Job 1, 2, Rev 12:10, Ps 109:6)
          3. 2 The Lord said to Satan, "The Lord rebuke you, Satan! (Jude 9)
          4. Indeed, the Lord who has chosen Jerusalem rebuke you!
           5. Is this (Jerusalem) not a brand plucked from the fire? (Yes) " (Amos 4:11)
      B. 3 Now Joshua was clothed with filthy garments and standing before the angel (Jesus). (Isa 64:6)
           1. 4 He (Jesus) spoke and said to those (Angel's) who were standing before him, saying,
           2. "Remove the filthy garments from him (Joshua)." (Isa 64:6, Matt 22:11)
               a. Again he (Jesus) said to him (Joshua),
               b. "See, I have taken your iniquity away from you
               c. and will clothe you with festal robes." (Matt 22:11, Lk 15:22, Rev 19:8)
      C. 5 Then I (Zechariah) said,
           1. "Let them (Angels before Jesus, 3:4) put a clean turban on his (Joshua's) head." (Job 29:14)
               a. So they (Angels) put a clean turban on his (Joshua's) head
               b. and clothed him with garments (festal robes), (Matt 22:11, Lk 15:22, Rev 19:8, Isa 61:10)
               c. while the angel of the Lord (Jesus) was standing by.
 IX. the angel of the Lord (Jesus) admonishes Joshua the high priest, 3:6-10 ¶
      A. 6 And the angel of the Lord (Jesus) admonished (assured) Joshua, saying,
           1. 7 "Thus says the Lord of hosts (the Father),
               a. 'If you (Joshua) will walk in My ways
               b. and if you (Joshua) will perform My service, (1 Kings 2:3)
               c. then you (Joshua), will also govern My house (Temple)
               d. and also have charge of My courts,
               e. and I (the Father) will grant you
                    i. free access (to the Lord) among these (Angel's, 3:4a, 5) who are standing here.
      B. 8 'Now listen, Joshua the high priest, you and your friends who are sitting in front of you—
           1. indeed they (Joshua's friends or priests) are men (priests) who are a symbol,
           2. for (Reason) behold, I (the Father) am going to
               a. bring in My (the Father's) servant (Jesus) the Branch (Jesus).
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3. 9 'For (Reason) behold, the stone (Jesus) that I (the Father) have set before Joshua;
              a. on one stone (Jesus) are seven eyes (Zech 4:10, Rev 5:6).
          4. Behold, I (the Father) will engrave an inscription on it (the stone, Jesus),'
              a. declares the Lord of hosts (the Father),
          5. 'and I (the Father) will remove the iniquity of that land (of Judah) in one day. (Zech 12:10, 13:1,
             Rom 11:25-27)
          6. 10 'In that day,' declares the Lord of hosts (the Father),
              a. 'every one of you (of Judah) will invite his neighbor
              b. to sit under his vine and under his fig tree." (1 Kings 4:25, Isa 36:16, Mic 4:4)
 X. A Lampstand, Bowl, 7 Spouts, and Two Olive Trees 4:1-7 ¶ (Feb 15<sup>th</sup>) (519BC) (at Night)
     A. 1 Then the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me (Zechariah) returned and roused me,
          1. as (Simile) a man who is awakened from his sleep.
     B. 2 He (Jesus) said to me (Zechariah), "What do you see?"
          1. And I (Zechariah) said, "I see, and behold, a lampstand all of gold
              a. with its (lampstand's) bowl on the top of it (lampstand),
              b. and its (lampstand's) seven lamps on it (lampstand)
              c. with seven spouts belonging to each of the (7) lamps which are on the top of it;
          2. 3 also two olive trees by it (the bowl), (Jer 11:15–17)
              a. one (olive tree) on the right side of the bowl
              b. and the other (olive tree) on its (the bowl's) left side."
     C. 4 Then I (Zechariah) said to the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me (Zechariah) saying,
          1. "What are these (lampstand + bowl + two olive trees), my lord (Jesus)?"
              a. 5 So the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me answered and said to me,
              b. "Do you (Zech.) not know what these (lampstand + bowl + 2 olive trees) are ?" (Zech 4:11-14)
              c. And I (Zechariah) said, "No, my lord (Jesus)."
          2. 6 Then he (Jesus) said to me, "This is the word of the Lord to Zerubbabel (Gov, Hag 1:1) saying,
              a. 'Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,' says the Lord of hosts (the Father).
          3. 7 'What are you, O great mountain?
              a. Before Zerubbabel you (great mountain of Zion?) will become a plain;
              b. and he (Zerubbabel) will bring forth the top stone (Capstone of Temple)
                   i. with shouts of "Grace, grace to it (the Temple)!"'"
XI. Zerubbabel the Temple and the 7 eyes of the Lord, Zechariah 4:8-10 ¶ (Feb 15<sup>th</sup>) (519BC) (Night)
     A. 8 Also the word of the Lord came to me (Zechariah), saying,
          1. 9 "The hands of Zerubbabel (governor of Judah, Hag 1:1) have laid the foundation of this house
            (the Temple), and his hands will finish it (the Temple).
          2. Then you (Zechariah) will know that the Lord of hosts (the Father) has sent me (Jesus) to you.
          3. 10 "For who has despised the day of small things?
          4. But these seven (eyes of the Lord) will be glad
              a. when they (eyes of the Lord) see the plumb line (of Wall, Amos 7:7-8)
              b. in the hand of Zerubbabel (governor of Judah)
              c. these (seven eyes) are the eyes of the Lord (Zech 1:10, 3:9, 4:10, 6:4-7, 2 Chr 16:9, Rev 5:6)
              d. which range to and fro (patrol, go about) throughout the earth." (Zech 1:10)
XII. The two olive trees, two olive branches, two golden pipes, golden oil and the seven pipes, 4:11–14 ¶
                                     I. (Feb 15<sup>th</sup>) (519BC) (at Night)
     B. 11 Then I (Zechariah) said to him (the angel of the Lord, Jesus),
          1. "What are these two olive trees on the right of the lampstand and on its left?"
                                     I. (Zech 4:1-5) (Jer 11:15-17)
     C. 12 And I (Zechariah) answered (Jesus) the second time and said to him (Jesus),
          1. "What are the two olive branches which are beside the two golden pipes,
              a. which (two olive branches) empty the golden oil from themselves (olive branches)?"
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D. 13 So he (Jesus) answered me (Zechariah), saying,
           1. "Do you (Zechariah) not know what these (olive branches) are?"
               a. And I (Zechariah) said, "No, my lord."
      E. 14 Then he (Jesus) said,
           1. "These (two olive branches) are the two anointed ones
               a. who are standing by the Lord of the whole earth." (Rev 11:3-41,
XIII. A Flying Scroll: The Curse over the Whole Land, 5:1-4 ¶ (Feb 15<sup>th</sup>) (519BC) (at Night)
      A. 1 Then I (Zechariah) lifted up my eyes again and looked, and behold, there was a flying scroll.
      B. 2 And he (Jesus) said to me, "What do you see?"
           1. And I (Zechariah) answered, "I see a flying scroll;
           2. its (flying scroll's) length is twenty cubits (30') and its width ten cubits (15')."
      C. 3 Then he (Jesus) said to me (Zechariah),
           1. "This (scroll) is the curse that is going forth over the face of the whole land;
           2. surely everyone who steals will be purged away
               a. according to the writing on one side (of flying scroll),
           3. and everyone who swears will be purged away
               a. according to the writing on the other side (of flying scroll). (2 sides, Ex 32:15)
      D. 4 "I (Father) will make it (flying scroll) go forth," declares the Lord of hosts (Father), "
           1. and it (flying scroll) will enter the house of the thief
           2. and (enter) the house of the one who swears falsely by My name (Father),;
           3. and it (flying scroll) will spend the night within that house
           4. and consume it (the house) with its timber and stones."
XIV. The Ephah (Basket) with a Woman and two Women with wings take Ephah to build Temple, 5:5-11 ¶
    (Feb 15<sup>th</sup>) (519BC) (at Night)
      A. 5 Then the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me (Zechariah) went out and said to me,
           1. "Lift up now your eyes and see what this is going forth."
      B. 6 I (Zechariah) said, "What is it?"
           1. And he (Jesus) said, "This is the ephah (Basket, 37.2 lbs of Wheat) going forth."
           2. Again he (Jesus) said, "This is their appearance (iniquity, Zech 3:9, Jer 50:20) in all the land
      C. 7 (and behold, a lead cover was lifted up); and this is a woman sitting inside the ephah (Basket)."
      D. 8 Then he (Jesus) said, "This is Wickedness!"
           1. And he (Jesus) threw her (a women) down into the middle of the ephah (Basket)
           2. and cast the lead weight on its (Basket's) opening.
      E. 9 Then I (Zechariah) lifted up my eyes and looked,
           1. and there two women were coming out with the wind in their wings;
           2. and they had wings like (simile) the wings of a stork,
           3. and they lifted up the ephah (Basket) between the earth and the heavens.
      F. 10 I (Zechariah) said to the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me,
           1. "Where are they (two women) taking the ephah (Basket)?"
      G. 11 Then he (Jesus) said to me,
           1. "To build a temple (house) for her (a women) in the land of Shinar (Babylon, Gen 11:1-2);
           2. and when it (temple) is prepared,
           3. she (a women) will be set there (in temple) on her own pedestal."
XV. The four chariots, the four spirits of heaven, patrol the earth, 6:1–8 ¶ (Feb 15<sup>th</sup>) (519BC) (at Night)
      A. 1 Now I (Zechariah) lifted up my eyes again and looked,

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B. and behold, four chariots were coming forth from between the two mountains;
            1. and the mountains were bronze mountains.
            2. 2 With the first chariot were red horses,
           3. with the second chariot black horses,
           4. 3 with the third chariot white horses,
            5. and with the fourth chariot strong dappled horses.
       C. 4 Then I (Zechariah) spoke and said to the angel (Jesus) who was speaking with me,
       D. "What are these (4 chariots and horses), my lord?"
            1. 5 the angel (Jesus) replied to me (Zechariah),
            2. "These (4 chariots and horses), are the four spirits of heaven,
           3. going forth after standing before the Lord of all the earth,
           4. 6 with one (2<sup>nd</sup> chariot) of which the black horses are going forth
                a. to the north country (the land of Shinar, Babylon);
            5. and the white ones (horses of the 2<sup>nd</sup> chariot) go forth after them (the black horses),
           6. while the (strong) dappled ones (dappled horses, 6:3) go forth to the south country (Egypt).
       E. 7 "When the strong ones (dappled horses, 6:3) went out,
            1. they (dappled horses, 6:3) were eager to go to patrol the earth."
            2. And He (Jesus) said, "Go, patrol the earth."
            3. So they (dappled horses, 6:3) patrolled the earth. (Zech 1:10-11)
       F. 8 Then He (Jesus) cried out to me and spoke to me saying,
            1. "See, those (black + white horses) who are going to the land of the north (Shinar, Babylon)
            2. have appeased My (Jesus') wrath in the land of the north (Shinar, Babylon)."
XVI. The Crowning of Joshua the High Priest, Like Future Messiah, 6:9–15,¶ (Feb 15<sup>th</sup>) (519BC) (at Night)
       A. 9 The word of the LORD also came to me (Zechariah) (1:1, 1:7, 7:1, 8:1), saying,
       B. 10 "Take an offering from the exiles (of Israel), from Heldai, Tobijah and Jedaiah;
            1. and you (Zechariah) go the same day and enter the house of Josiah the son of Zephaniah,
            2. where they (Israel exiles) have arrived from Babylon.
       C. 11 "Take silver and gold (Ezra 7:14-18), make an ornate crown
            1. and set it on the head of Joshua, the son of Jehozadak, the high priest (of Aaron).
       D. 12 "Then say to him (Joshua), 'Thus says the LORD of hosts (the Father),
            1. "Behold, a man (Jesus) whose name is Branch, (Zech 3:8, Jer 23:5)
            2. for He (Jesus) will branch out (Isa 11:1) from where He is;
            3. and He (Jesus) will build the temple of the LORD. (Zech 1:16-17) (Ezekiel's Temple)
       E. 13 "Yes, it is He (Jesus) who will build the temple of the LORD, (Ezekiel's Temple)
            1. and He (Jesus) who will bear the honor and sit and rule on His throne. (Luke 1:32-33, Isa 9:7)
            2. Thus, He (Jesus) will be a priest (of Melchizedek, Heb 5:5-6) on His throne,
            and the counsel of peace will be between the two offices (King + Priest)."
       F. 14 "Now the crown (of Joshua) will become a reminder in the temple of the LORD (Ezra's Temple)
            1. to Helem, Tobijah, Jedaiah and Hen the son of Zephaniah. (the visiting exiles of Israel)
       G. 15 "Those who are far off will come and build the temple of the LORD." (Done, 515 BC, Ezra 6:15)
            1. Then you (Zechariah) will know that the LORD of hosts (the Father) has sent me to you.
            2. And it (Building of Temple) will take place if you completely obey the LORD your God.
XVII. The Delegation of Bethel's Questions Concerning Fasts, 7:1–7,¶ (Dec 7<sup>th</sup>) (518BC)
      A. 1 In the fourth year of King Darius (518BC), the word of the LORD came to Zechariah
            1. on the fourth day of the ninth month, which is Chislev. (Dec 7<sup>th</sup>), Zech 7:1
       B. 2 Now the town of Bethel had sent Sharezer and Regemmelech and their men
            1. to seek the favor of the LORD,
       C. 3 (They) speaking to the priests who belong to the house of the LORD of hosts (the Father),
            1. and (speaking) to the prophets,
            2. saying, [Q:] "Shall I (Bethel) weep in the fifth month and abstain,
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a. as I (Bethel) have done these many years (70 years)?"
        D. 4 Then the word of the LORD of hosts (the Father) came to me (Zechariah), saying,
        E. 5 [A:] "Say to all the people of the land (of Israel) and to the priests,
        F. [Q: Rhetorical] 'When you (all) fasted and mourned in the fifth and seventh months
             1. these seventy years (of Captivity), was it (fasts) actually for Me that you (all) fasted?
       G. 6 [Q: Rhetorical] 'When you eat and drink, do you not eat for yourselves and do you not drink for
          yourselves?
       H. 7 [Q:] 'Are not these (fasts) the words which the LORD proclaimed by the former prophets,
             1. when Jerusalem was inhabited and prosperous along with its cities around it,
             2. and the Negev and the foothills were inhabited?"
XVIII. Israel Refused to Repent or Listen to the Lord, therefore were Scattered, 7:8–14, ¶ (Dec 7<sup>th</sup>) (518BC)
       A. 8 Then the word of the LORD came to Zechariah saying,
        B. 9 "Thus has the LORD of hosts (the Father) said,
             1. 'Dispense true justice and practice kindness and compassion each to his brother;
             2. 10 and do not oppress the widow or the orphan, the stranger or the poor;
             3. and do not devise evil in your hearts against one another.'
        C. 11 "But (in contrast) they (Israel) refused to pay attention
             1. and turned a stubborn shoulder
             2. and stopped their ears from hearing. 7:13
       D. 12 "They (Israel) made their hearts like flint (hardened)
             1. so that (Reason) they could not hear the law
                 a. and (not hear) the words which the LORD of hosts had sent
                      i. (sent) by His Spirit through the former prophets;
             2. therefore (Because of that) great wrath came from the LORD of hosts (the Father).
        E. 13 "And just as (in same way) He called and they (Israel) would not listen, 7:11
             1. so they (Israel) (in same way) called and I would not listen," says the LORD of hosts (the Father);
        F. 14 "but I (the Lord) scattered them (Israel) with a storm wind among all the nations
             1. whom they (Israel) have not known.
            2. Thus the land is <u>desolated</u> behind them (Israel)
                 a. so that (Reason) no one went back and forth,

                 a. when the spoil taken from you (fem, Jerusalem) will be divided among you (your midst).
            2. 2 For (Reason) I will gather all the nations against Jerusalem to battle, (12:3)
                 a. and the city will be captured, the houses plundered, the women ravished
                 b. and half of the city (inhabitants) exiled (captivity),
                 c. but (Contrast) the rest of the people (2<sup>nd</sup> half, remnant) will not be cut off from the city.
            3. 3 Then the LORD will go forth and fight against those nations, (12:8-9)
                 a. as when He fights on a day of battle.
        B. 4 In that day His feet will stand on the Mount of Olives.
             1. which is in front of Jerusalem on the east;
             2. and the Mount of Olives will be split in its middle
                 a. from east to west by a very large valley,
            3. so that (purpose) half of the mountain will move toward the north
            4. and the other half (mountain will move) toward the south.

         a. neither day nor night,
    3. but (Contrast) it will come about that at evening time there will be light (Isa 60:19b, Isa 24:23).
F. In that day living waters will flow out of Jerusalem, 14:8¶
     1. 8 And in that day living waters will flow out of Jerusalem,
         a. half of them (living waters) toward the eastern sea
         b. and the other half (living waters) toward the western sea;
         c. it (living waters) will be in summer as well as in winter.
G. In that day the LORD will be King over all the earth, 14:9¶
     1. 9 And the LORD (Jesus) will be king over all the earth;

    2. (they) will go up (to raised Jerusalem) from year to year (Isa 2:2, Zech 8:23, Zech 14:1, Isa 66:23)
         a. to worship the King, the LORD of hosts,
         b. and to <u>celebrate</u> the Feast of Booths. (Lev 23:33-43)
    3. 17 And it will be that whichever of the families of the earth
         a. does not go up to Jerusalem to worship the King, the LORD of hosts,
         b. there will be no rain on them (the families).
    4. 18 If the family of Egypt does not go up or enter,
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- 5. then **no** rain will fall on them (Egypt);
- 6. it (no rain) will be the plague with which the LORD smites the nations
  - a. who do not go up to celebrate the Feast of Booths.
- 7. 19 This (no rain) will be the punishment of Egypt, and the punishment of all the nations K. In that day the Horses and the Cooking Pots will be Holy to the Lord, 14:20–21¶
  - 1. 20 In that day there will be inscribed on the bells of the horses, "HOLY TO THE LORD."
  - 2. And the cooking pots in the LORD'S house will be like the bowls before the altar.
  - 3. 21 Every cooking pot in Jerusalem and in Judah will be holy to the LORD of hosts;
  - 4. and all who sacrifice will come and take of them (pots) and boil in them.
  - 5. And there will no longer be a Canaanite in the house of the LORD of hosts in that day.
