Zechariah - Historical Background

BOOK OF ZECHARIAH

Zechariah is Prophecy, as seen in "the Word of the Lord (of Hosts) came" to Zechariah, 9 times, (Zech 1:1, 1:7, 4:8, 7:1, 7:8, 7:4, 8:1, 8:18) AND "declares the Lord" is found 17 times and 347 times in Old Testament.

Zechariah Prophesy's about the 1st Coming (Zech 9:9, 11:12-13) and 2nd Coming (Zech 9:10) of Christ and of the Battle of Amageddon (Zech 12, 13, 14).

Book of Zechariah, is cited, 41 times, in New Testament Books.

Zechariah contains most prophecies of **crucifixion** in OT, (Zec 9:9; 11:12, 13; 13:6, 7), except Psalms. **Zechariah speaks of Christ as:**

"the Angel of the Lord", Zech 3:1-2, "the righteous Branch", Zech 3:8, 6:12-13, 12:8, "King Priest", Zech 6:13, 9:9, "cornerstone", Zech 10:4, One sold for 30 pieces of silver, Zech 11:13, One "pieced", Zech 12:10

ZECHARIAH: THE MAN, PROPHET, AND PRIEST

The postexilic Prophet **Zechariah** was a **Levite** born in **Babylon** (Neh 12:1, 16).

He was the son of **Berekiah** and the grandson of **Iddo** the priest (Zech. 1:1) and "a descendant of **Iddo**" (Ezra 5:1; 6:14; cf. Neh. 12:4, 16).

Zechariah was both a prophet and a priest.

Zechariah's name, means "Yahweh (the Lord) remembers"

Zechariah was a contemporary of **Haggai** the prophet, **Zerubbabel** the governor, and **Joshua** the high priest (Ezra 5:1–2, Zech. 3:1, 4:6, 6:11).

THE HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The fall of Northern Kingdom of Israel (10 tribes) to Assyrians was in (722 BC)

The fall of Southern Kingdom of Judah (2 tribes) to Babylonians in (605 BC + 597 BC + 586 BC)

In 586 BC the 1st Temple was Looted and Destroyed by Nebuchadnezzar.

Most Jews were deported to Babylon for 70 years, as prophesied by Jeremiah (Jer 25:11, 29:10).

During the **Exile** the Prophet **Daniel** was told that **Gentile kingdoms** would be dominant over the **Kingdom** of **S. Judah** and **N. Israel**, until **God** would set up **His kingdom** on the earth under the rule of the **Messiah** (Dan 2, Dan 7). This period was referred to by **Jesus** as "the times of the **Gentiles**" (Luke 21:24).

Then Babylonian Empire fell to the Persian Empire in (539 BC),

Cyrus the Great was stirred by God to decree that the Jews could return to Jerusalem

to **rebuild** their **Temple** in (538 BC), (Ezra 1:1-2, 6, 6:3-5, 2 Chr 36:22, Isa 44:28).

However, only 50,000 Jews (including Haggai and Zechariah) returned

under **Zerubbabel** the governor and **Joshua** the high priest (Ezra 2).

Levitical sacrifices were soon reinstituted, on a rebuilt altar of burnt offering (Ezra 3:1-6).

In, 536 BC, the foundation of the Temple was laid (Ezra 3:8–13; 5:16).

However, external oppression and internal depression halted the rebuilding of the Temple

for about 16 more years of spiritual apathy, until the rule of the Persian King Darius I (522-486 BC).

In the second year of **Darius I** (520 BC) God raised up **Haggai** the prophet to encourage the **Jews** in **rebuilding** (Ezra 5:1–2, Hag 1:1).

Zechariah began his prophetic ministry (520 BC) (Zech 1:1), encouraging the Jews to spiritual renewal and motivating them to rebuild the Temple by revealing to them God's plans for Israel's future.

The people completed the Temple in 515 BC (Ezra 6:15).

The **prophecies** of Zechariah 9–14 were written later, about 480BC to 470BC.

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
PURPOSE OF BOOK

Zechariah is the most Messianic, Apocalyptic (predicting disaster), and Eschatological in the OT. Primarily, it is prophecy about **Jesus Christ**, focusing on **His** coming glory as a means to **comfort Israel**. **Zechariah** 1:17

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17 "Again, proclaim, saying, 'Thus says the Lord of hosts,
"My cities will again overflow with prosperity,
and the Lord will again comfort Zion and again choose Jerusalem." "
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While the book is filled with visions, prophecies, signs, celestial visitors, and the voice of God, it is also practical, dealing with issues like repentance, divine care, salvation, and holy living.

God used Zechariah to bring a rich, abundant outburst of promise for the future to sustain the faithful remnant of Israel through those silent years until Jesus Comes.





The Persian Empire: from the Fall of Babylonian Empire, in 539 BC, Dan 5:24-31

Solomon's Temple, 1st Temple, Destroyed, in 586 BC, by Babylonian's

1st Decree by King Cyrus, to Build, 2nd Temple, in 538 BC, Ezra 3:10-11

Foundation of the 2nd Temple Laid, Priest and Levites Celebrated, in 536 BC, Ezra 3:10-11

2nd Decree by King Xerxes I, to Stop Work on 2nd Temple in Jerusalem, Ezra 4:21

In the 2nd year of King Darius I, Zechariah and Haggai began Ministries, in 520 BC, Zech 1:1, Hag 1:1

3rd Decree by King Darius I, to Build, 2nd Temple, in 520 BC, Ezra 6:2-5

Ezra's Temple, 2nd Temple, Completed, in 515 BC, Ezra 6:14

4th Decree by King Artaxerxes I, to Build, Walls, Gates, and City of Jerusalem, in 444 BC, Neh 2:7-9

"So you are to know and discern that **from the issuing of a decree** (Neh 2:7-9) to **restore** and **rebuild**

Jerusalem, Dan 9:24, (by King Artaxerxes I)

until Messiah the Prince there will be seven weeks (49 yrs) and sixty-two weeks (434 yrs);

it (Jerusalem, Dan 9:25) will be built again, with plaza and moat, even in times of distress.

Nehemiah - Finishes Building Wall and Gates in 52 days, in 444 BC, Neh 6:15, 7:1

Jewish Calendar and Prophetic Years have 360 days, not 365 days. Example: (42 mo = 1260 days or 3.5 x 360 days = 1260 days) in Rev 11:2-3

So 483 years x 360 days = 173,880 days per Jewish Calendar. Then 173,880 days / 365 days = 476.38 years per Gregorian Calendar, Then 476 years x 365 days = 173,740 days

Leap Year Adjustment: 476 years / 4 = 119 Days - 3 Days = 116 Days. Years: 300 BC, 200 BC, 100 BC, are $\frac{\text{not}}{\text{leap}}$ years. So minus 3 Days, Year: 400 BC, $\frac{\text{is}}{\text{s}}$ a leap year.

So left in 119 day total. Then from March 5, 444 BC, plus 476 years = March 5, 33 AD is (no year zero), 173,740 days + 116 days = 173,856 days to March 5, 33 AD

Then 173,880 days - 173,856 days = 24 days to add. Then March 5, 33 AD + 24 days = March 30, 33 AD > Triumphant Entry. Jesus Cut off (killed), April 4, 33 AD

In (Oct-Nov) of the second year of the reign of the (Persian King) Darius I (520BC),

the word of the Lord came to Zechariah the prophet, 1:1.

Two months earlier, the word of the Lord told Haggai to:

"rebuild the temple, that I may be pleased with it and be glorified," Hag 1:8

The Lord was angry with Israel's fathers, verse 2, and sent them to Exile for 70 years.

Immediate Audience: Zechariah Intended Audience: Nation of Israel

Verse 2 says: "The Lord was very angry with your (Israel's) fathers (forefathers).

Two months earlier, in 520 BC, the word of the Lord came to Haggai: Book of Haggai Israel consider your ways! Rebuild the temple, My house Lies Desolate Read Haggai 1:1-11 1 In the second year of Darius the king, on the first day of the sixth month, (Aug 29) (520BC) the word of the Lord came by the prophet Haggai to Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and to Joshua the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, saying, 2 "Thus says the Lord of hosts, 'This people says, "The time has not come, even the time for the house of the Lord to be rebuilt." " 3 Then the word of the Lord came by Haggai the prophet, saying, 4 "Is it time for you yourselves to dwell in your paneled houses while this house lies desolate?" 5 Now therefore, thus says the Lord of hosts, "Consider your ways! 6 "You have sown much, but harvest little; you eat, but there is not enough to be satisfied; you drink, but there is not enough to become drunk; you put on clothing, but no one is warm enough; and he who earns, earns wages to put into a purse with holes." 7 Thus says the Lord of hosts, "Consider your ways! 8 "Go up to the mountains, bring wood and rebuild the temple, that I may be pleased with it (Temple) and be glorified," says the Lord. 9 "You look for much, but behold, it comes to little; when you bring it home, I blow it away. Why?" declares the Lord of hosts, "Because of My house (Temple) which lies desolate, while each of you runs to his own house. 10 "Therefore, because of you the sky has withheld its dew and the earth has withheld its produce. 11 "I (the Lord) called for a drought on the land, on the mountains, on the grain, on the new wine, on the oil, on what the ground produces, on men, on cattle, and on all the labor of your hands."

The Governor, the High Priest, and the People Obey the voice of the Lord Read Haggai 1:12-15

12 Then **Zerubbabel** the son of Shealtiel, and **Joshua** the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, with all the remnant of the people,

<u>obeyed the voice of the Lord their God</u> and <u>(obeyed) the words of Haggai</u> the prophet, as the Lord their God had sent him.

And the people showed reverence for the Lord.

13 Then Haggai, the messenger of the Lord, spoke by the commission of the Lord to the people saying, "'I am with you,' declares the Lord."

14 So the Lord stirred up the spirit of Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and (stirred up) the spirit of Joshua the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, and (stirred up) the spirit of all the remnant of the people; and they (the people) came and worked on the house of the Lord of hosts, their God,
15 on the twenty-fourth day of the sixth month in the second year of Darius the king. (Sept 21) (520BC)

Notice in Verse 12, that <u>Everyone Obeyed</u> > the voice of the Lord and (obeyed) the words of Haggai the prophet and also that the Lord Israel's God had sent Haggai the prophet to them.

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In Verse 14, the Lord stirred up the spirit of Everyone > to work on the house (Temple) of the Lord
Sometimes God stirs up those that ARE His People to do something. Read Ezra 1:5
Sometimes God stirs up those NOT His People to do something. Read Ezra 1:1-2

until Jesus Comes again and builds His Temple and establishes His Kingdom on Earth.

3rd Temple: 70th Week of Daniel Temple or Tribulation Period Temple

27 "And he (Antichrist) will make a firm covenant with the many (Israel) for one week (7 Years),

but in the middle of the week (3 ½ Years) he (Antichrist) will put a stop to sacrifice and grain offering; Revelation 11:1–2

1 "Get up and measure the temple of God and the altar, and those who worship in it (the Temple).

2 and **they** (the nations) will tread underfoot the **holy city** (Jerusalem) for forty-two months.

4th Temple: Ezekiel's Temple: Ezekiel 40 to 48

Glory of the Lord will Return to Ezekiel's Temple by East Gate, Ezekiel 43:1-12

Time of Ezekiel's Temple is the Millennial Kingdom

when Jesus Comes again and establishes His Kingdom on Earth. Rev 20:4-6

Ezekiel's Temple is destroyed when the Earth passes away, therefore No Temple, Rev 21:1

1 Then I saw a **new heaven** and a **new earth**; for the **first heaven** and the **first earth** passed away, and there is **no longer any sea**. Rev 21:1

5th New Jerusalem out of Heaven from God, with No Temple Building

2 And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, (the City) made ready as a bride adorned for her husband. Rev 21:2

Revelation 21:22

22 I saw <u>no temple in it</u> (the city), for the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb are its (the city's) temple.

No Temple in New Jerusalem, for the Lord God and the Lamb are its Temple!
