Q1: What did Zechariah see, in 2:1? A1: "a man with a measuring line in his hand" (a Surveyor)
Q2: Zechariah asks the man where he is going, in Verse 2. Q: So where is the man going?
A2: "To measure Jerusalem, to see how wide it is and how long it is."

Q3: Who is the man who is to measure Jerusalem? Read Ezek 40:3 and 40:5
A3: Jesus will measure Jerusalem, in Ezek 40:3 and 40:5, where Ezekiel describes Jesus.
Q4: Who is the angel who was speaking with Zechariah, in Verse 3? Read Zech 1:9-12
A4: the angel who was speaking with Zechariah was the angel and the angel of the Lord (Jesus), in 1:9-12
Q5: "another angel was came out to meet (Jesus)", in Verse 3. What did Jesus tell the angel to do, in 2:4?
A5: "Run, speak to that young man (Zechariah), saying, 'Jerusalem will be inhabited without walls
Q6: Who is the young man, in Verse 4? A6: Zechariah
Q7: What is the reason given that "Jerusalem will be inhabited without walls (unprotected)", in Verse 4?
A7: (Reason is) "because of the multitude of: Both men and cattle within it (Jerusalem)"
Q8: Then, in Verse 5, the word "For", a conjunction, is used to link previous sentence.
    So what will I (the angel speaking, 2:3, Jesus), as declared by the Lord (the Father), "be", Verse 5?
A8: I (Jesus),' declares the Lord (the Father), 'will be a wall of fire around her (Jerusalem),
         and I (Jesus) will be the glory in her (Jerusalem's) midst."
                                                                       Q: Who is "her"? A: (Jerusalem)
Though without walls, Jerusalem will dwell securely, Because of divine protection, by I (Jesus), Verse 5
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I (Jesus) will be "will be a wall of fire around her (Jerusalem)" Because, without walls, Verse 4 and I (Jesus) will be the glory in her (Jerusalem's) midst, in Ezekiel's Temple, during the Millennium.

Q1: What is the (Reason) given for the Captives of Israel to Flee Babylon, in 2:8?
A1: For (Reason) thus says the Lord of hosts (the Father), "After glory He (the Father)
       has sent Me (Jesus) against the nations which plunder you (Jerusalem),
             for he (of Nations) who touches you (of Zion), touches the apple of His (the Father's) eye.
Q2: Who is "the Lord of hosts" and "He" and "Me" and "His", in Verse 8?
A2: the Lord of hosts (the Father), He (the Father) has sent Me (Jesus), and His (the Father's) eye.
Q3: Who "will wave My hand over them (Nations)", in Verse 9? A3: I (Jesus) will, in Verse 9
Jesus will wave His Hand over the Nations so that those Nations will be plunder, for their slaves, Verse 9B
Q4: What is the (Reason) for the daughters of Zion to sing for Joy and be Glad, Verse 10?
A4: for (Reason) behold I (Jesus) am coming and I (Jesus) will dwell in your (of Zion) midst", in Verse 9
    In Verse 11 it says, "Many nations will join themselves to the Lord in that day and (those nations)
         will become My (Jesus') people.
                                             Not just Israel is involved, But "Many Nations" will be there.
Q5: In Verse 11B, Who will "will dwell in your (Jesus' peoples') midst? And What will they know?
A5: "I (Jesus) will dwell in your (Jesus' peoples') midst". Jesus will dwell with Israel and Nations believers.
    You (Jesus' peoples') will know that the Lord of hosts (the Father) has sent Me (Jesus) to you.
Q6: What 2 Things will the Lord do, in Verse 12?
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"The Lord will possess Judah as His portion in the holy land, and (the Lord) will again choose Jerusalem.

A2: What? "His holy temple", Hab 2:20. Where? Heaven "Your (the Lord's) holy habitation, from heaven"
Habakkuk 2:20
20 "But the Lord is in His holy temple. Let all the earth be silent before Him."
Deuteronomy 26:15
15 'Look down from Your (the Lord's) holy habitation, from heaven, and bless Your people Israel,

Four Horns (4 Nations) which have scattered Judah, Israel and Jerusalem. 1:19
But (4) craftsmen (are those Nations used by the Lord) have come to terrify them (4 Nations),
    to throw down the (4) horns (4 Nations), 1:21
Vision of: the Surveyor of Jerusalem
Then a Man (Jesus) will come to measure Jerusalem, Ezek 40:3 and 40:5
     Jerusalem will be inhabited without walls (unprotected), 2:4
For I (Jesus),' declares the Lord (the Father), 'will be a wall of fire around her (Jerusalem),
