XVII. The Delegation of Bethel's Questions Concerning Fasts, 7:1–7, ¶ (Dec 7th) (518BC) Temple Under Const

- A. 1 In the fourth year of King Darius (518BC), the word of the LORD came to Zechariah 1. on the fourth day of the ninth month, which is Chislev. (Dec 7th), Zech 7:1
- B. 2 Now the town of **Bethel** had sent **Sharezer** and **Regemmelech** and **their men** 1. to **seek** the favor of **the LORD**,
- C. 3 (They) speaking to the priests who belong to the house of the LORD of hosts, 1. and (speaking) to the prophets,
 - 2. saying,[Q:] "Shall I (Bethel) weep in the fifth month and abstain,
 - a. as I (Bethel) have done these many years (70 years)?"
- D. 4 Then the word of the LORD of hosts came to me (Zechariah), saying,
- E. 5 [A:] "Say to all the people of the land (of Israel) and to the priests,
- F. [Q: Rhetorical] 'When you (all) fasted and mourned in the fifth and seventh months
 1. these seventy years (of Captivity), was it (fasts) actually for Me that you (all) fasted?
- G. 6 [Q: Rhet.] 'When you eat and drink, do you not eat for yourselves and do you not drink for yourselves?
- H. 7 [Q: Rhet.] 'Are not these (fasts) the words which the LORD proclaimed by the former prophets,
 1. when Jerusalem was inhabited and prosperous along with its cities around it,
 2. and the Negev and the foothills were inhabited?' "

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 7:1–7

A Delegation of **Bethel** – has Questions Concerning their Yearly Fasts

The TIME changes from Feb 15th, **519 BC**, for the **9 Visions**, to Dec 7th, **518 BC**, 22 months later. **Ezra's Temple** is still under construction, until **515 BC**. A **Delegation** arrives from **Bethel**, 12 miles North of **Jerusalem**, to seek the favor of the LORD. The **Delegation** speaks to the **Priests** and **Prophets** in **Jerusalem** about their desire to abstain from the observance of fasting in the fifth month (July–Aug, *Ab*),

which **Memorializes** the Destruction of **Jerusalem** and **the Temple** by **Nebuchadnezzar**. **Israel** has been self-imposing, a **Memorializing** of, **4 different Months** each year, for **70 years**, Zech 8:19 **The LORD** doesn't answer the Question, But instead gives **3 Rhetorical Questions** to make **His** Point.

Q1: WHAT did, the **Bethel Delegation** ask the **Priests** and the **Prophets,** in Verse 3 ?

A1: Shall I (Bethel) weep in the fifth month and abstain, as I (Bethel) have done these many years (70 yrs)? They wanted to <u>abstain</u> or <u>Stop</u> Weeping, as Part of the Fast they did on the fifth month of each year.

The LORD's > 3 Rhetorical Questions in Response to Delegation's Question

- 1st Rhetorical Question the Lord responds with, "When you (all) fasted and mourned in the fifth and seventh months these seventy years (of Captivity), was it (fasts) actually for Me that you (all) fasted?"
 Q2: WHAT is the implied answer to the Lord's Question?
 A1: NO, the Fasts were Not for the Lord
- 2nd Rhetorical Question the Lord responds with, "When you eat and drink, do you not eat for yourselves and do you not drink for yourselves ?"

Q3: WHAT is the implied answer to the Lord's Question? A1: YES, they ate and drank for themselves.
 3rd Rhetorical Question the Lord responds with, "Are not these (fasts) the words which the LORD proclaimed by the former prophets,...."

Q4: WHAT is the implied answer to **the Lord's** Question? **A1:** NO, Not from **the former prophets *The Lord** doesn't answer the **Delegation's Question** until Zechariah 8:19.

Israel's self-imposed Fasting and Memorializing, during the 70 Year Exile Israel made the Fasting for them and Not "for" the Lord, Zech 7:5-7

Israel's Fasts > Read Zechariah 7:3 and Read Zechariah 8:19

Israel Memorializes: with **Fasts, Weeping,** and **Mourning,** during the **70 Year Exile** (1) the Siege of Jerusalem, (2) the Famine in City, (3) the Burning of Solomon's Temple and breaking down of City Walls, and (4) the Killing of **Gedaliah**, Good Governor of Jerusalem

Israel Memorialized: the **tenth month of year**, *Tevet* > Event of **588 BC Fast** of the **tenth month**, (9th year of King Zedekiah, on 10th day of **10th Month**), **588 BC** (1) **Because: Nebuchadnezzar** laid siege on **Jerusalem**, 2 Kings 25:2, Jer 39:1

Israel Memorialized: the **fourth month of year**, *Tammuz* > Event of **586 BC Fast** of the **fourth month** (11th year of King Zedekiah, on 9th day of 4th Month), **586 BC** (2) Because: Famine in Jerusalem, No Food, the City broken into, 2 Kings 25:3, Jer 52:6-7

Israel Memorialized: the **fifth month of year**, **Av** > Event of **586 BC Fast** of the **fifth month**, (11th year of **King Zedekiah**, on 7th day of **5th Month**), **586 BC**, (3) **Because: Nebuchadnezzar**, Burned **Temple** and broke down **City** Walls, 2 Kings 25:8-10, Jer 52:12-14,

Israel Memorialized: the seventh month of year, Tishri > Event of 586 BC

Fast of the seventh month, (11th year of King Zedekiah, on 7th Month), 586 BC
(4) Because: Ishmael with 10 men, struck down Gedaliah, Governor of Jerusalem, 2 Kings 25:25, Jer 41:1-2

Four public **Fast Days** commemorating the destruction of the First **Temple** were instituted by **the people** during the 70 year **Exile** and Not by **the Lord**. (1) Asara b'Tevet (beginning of the Babylonian siege of Jerusalem) tenth month
10 Tevet,
(2) Shiv'a Asar b'Tammuz (first breach in the walls of Jerusalem during the Babylonian siege) forth month
17 Tammuz, If 17 Tammuz falls on Shabbat, the fast is observed on Sunday (18 Tammuz)
(3) Tish'a b'Av (destruction of the Temple) fifth month
9 Av, If 9 Av falls on Shabbat, the fast is observed on Sunday (10 Av)
(4) Tzom Gedalya (assassination of the governor Gedaliah) seventh month
3 Tishri, If 3 Tishri falls on Shabbat, the fast is observed on Sunday (4 Tishri)

XVIII. Israel Refused to Repent or Listen to the Lord, therefore were Scattered, 7:8–14, ¶ (Dec 7th) (518BC)

- A. 8 Then the word of the LORD came to Zechariah saying,
- B. 9 "Thus has the LORD of hosts said,
 - 1. 'Dispense true justice and practice kindness and compassion each to his brother;
 - 2. 10 and do not oppress the <u>widow</u> or the <u>orphan</u>, the <u>stranger</u> or the <u>poor</u>;
 - 3. and do not devise evil in your hearts against one another.'
- C. 11 "But (in contrast) they (Israel) refused to pay attention
 - 1. and **turned** a stubborn shoulder
 - 2. and **stopped their** ears from hearing. 7:13
- D. 12 "They (Israel) made their hearts like flint (hardened)
 - 1. so that (Reason) they could not hear the law
 - a. and (not hear) the words which the LORD of hosts had sent
 - i. (sent) by His Spirit through the former prophets;
 - 2. therefore (Because of that) great wrath came from the LORD of hosts.
- E. 13 "And just as (in same way) He called and they (Israel) would not listen, 7:11
 - so they (Israel) (in same way) called and I would not listen," says the LORD of hosts;
- F. 14 "but I (the Lord) scattered them (Israel) with a storm wind among all the nations
 - 1. whom they (Israel) have not known.
 - 2. Thus the land is <u>desolated</u> behind them (Israel)
 - a. so that (Reason) no one went back and forth,
 - 3. for they (Israel) made the pleasant land (of Israel) desolate."

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 7: 8-14

Israel Refused to Repent or Listen to the Lord, therefore they were Scattered

Q1: WHAT 8 Things has (in the past), did the LORD of hosts say to Israel, in Verses 9 & 10 ?

A1: (1) 'Dispense true justice (2) practice kindness (3) compassion each to his brother;

(4) do not **oppress** the <u>widow</u> or (5) the <u>orphan</u>, (6) the <u>stranger</u> or (7) the <u>poor</u>; and (8) do not **devise** <u>evil</u> in <u>your hearts</u> against <u>one another</u>.'

Q2: WHAT **4 Things** (in contrast to what **the Lord** just said), did **Israel** do, in Verses 11 & 12a ? **A2:** (1) **they** (Israel) **refused** to pay attention and (2) **turned** a stubborn shoulder

and (3) **stopped their** ears from hearing. (4) **"They** (Israel) **made their hearts** like flint (hardened) **Q3:** WHAT is the (Reason) given for Israel to **NOT Hear the Lord**, in Verse 12b ?

A3: so that (Reason) they (Israel) could NOT hear the law and (not hear) the words which the LORD ofhosts had sent (sent) by His Spirit through the former prophets.ReadIsaiah 6 passage is quoted in: Matt 13:13-16, Mark 4:12, Luke 8:10, John 12:37-41, Acts 28:26, and Rom 11:7-10.

Q4: WHAT was the Result of Israel NOT Listening to the Lord and His Prophets, in Verse 12d ? A4: therefore (Because of that) great wrath came from the LORD of hosts.

- Then the LORD said, just as (in same way) He called and they (Israel) would not listen, SO they (Israel) (in same way) called and I (the Lord) would not listen," 7:13
- **Q5:** WHAT did the LORD do to Israel, for NOT Listening to the Lord, in Verse 14a ?
- A5: "but I (the Lord) scattered them (Israel) with a storm wind among all the nations whom they (Israel) have not known.

Q6: WHAT became of **the Land** of **Israel**, because of **the Lord's Judgement** or **Wrath**, in Verse 14b ? **A6:** Thus **the land** is **desolated** behind **them** (Israel) **so that** (Reason) no one went back and forth,

for they (Israel) made the pleasant land (of Israel) <u>desolate</u> (by their sin)
