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Read Paragraph > Zechariah 8:1–8

The LORD, will return to Zion and will dwell in the midst of Jerusalem, with His People Working Outline > Zechariah 8:1–8 (Paragraphs ¶ from NAS Bible)

XIX. the LORD, will return to Zion and will dwell in Jerusalem, with His People, 8:1–8, ¶ (Dec 7th) (518BC)

- A. 1 Then the word of the LORD of hosts (the Father) came (to Zechariah), saying,
- B. 2 "Thus says the LORD of hosts (the Father),
 - 1. 'I am exceedingly jealous (Zech 1:17) for Zion (Mountain, Ps 2:6, Joel 2:1),
 - 2. yes, with great wrath I am jealous for her (Mt. Zion, Zech 1:14).
- C. 3 "Thus says the LORD (Jesus),
 - 1. 'I (Jesus) will return to Zion and will dwell in the midst of Jerusalem. (Zech 1:16, 2:10-11, Joel 3:17, Ezek 43:1-5, Isa 2:1-4, Isa 4:2-6)
 - 2. Then Jerusalem will be called the City of Truth,
 - 3. and the mountain (Mt. Zion) of the LORD of hosts (the Father)
 - a. (Mt. Zion) will be called the Holy Mountain.' (Ps 2:6, Joel 2:1)
- D. 4 "Thus says the LORD of hosts (the Father),
 - 1. 'Old men and old women will again sit in the streets of Jerusalem,
 - a. each <mark>man</mark> with <mark>his</mark> staff in <mark>his</mark> hand because of age. (Isa 65:20-22)
 - 2. 5 'And the streets of the city (Jer,) will be filled with boys and girls playing in its streets.'
- E. 6 "Thus says the LORD of hosts (the Father),
- F. [Q: Rhetorical] 'If it is too difficult in the sight of the remnant of this people in those days,
 1. will it also be too difficult (Jer 32:17, 27) in My sight ?' declares the LORD of hosts (the Father).
- G. 7 "Thus says the LORD of hosts (the Father),
 - 1. 'Behold, I am going to
 - a. save My people from the land of the east and from the land of the west;(Isa 43:5)
 - b. 8 and I will bring them (Israel) back and they will live in the midst of Jerusalem;
 - c. and they (Israel) shall be My people,
 - d. and I will be their (Israel's) God in truth and righteousness.'(Ezek 37:21-28)

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 8:1–8

The LORD, will return to **Zion** and **will** dwell in the midst of **Jerusalem**, with **His People** The TIME is still Dec 7th, **518 BC**, and **Ezra's Temple** is still under construction, until **515 BC**.

In Zechariah 7: 11-14, the Lord speaks of His Judgement on Israel, But now He speaks of Blessing.

Then the word of **the LORD of hosts** (the Father) came (to Zechariah), Zech 8:1 Q1: In Verse 2, **the LORD of hosts** (the Father), is exceedingly **jealous** for Zion. What is Zion? **Read** Ps 2:6 A1: Zion is Mt. Zion, in Jerusalem. "I have installed My King Upon Zion, My holy mountain", Ps 2:6

In Verse 2, the Father exceedingly jealous for Mt. Zion, with great wrath.

Q2: What does it mean to be **jealous** in a **Human** relationship, like with a wife or a girl friend ? **A2: Someone** is **jealous**, when they feel **angry** or bitter because they think that another person is trying to

take a lover, friend, spouse, or a possession, away from them, that may lead to a **response**.

Q3: In Verse 2, in <u>what sense</u> is the Father <u>exceedingly jealous</u> for Mt. Zion, with great wrath ?
 A3: the Father, with great wrath, is greatly angry because He knows that someone has taken His beloved Mt. Zion, leading to His revealing Mt. Zion's future restoration.

Q4: In Verse 3a, what 2 Major Things will happen ?

A4: 'I (Jesus) will (1) return to Zion and I (Jesus) will will (2) dwell in the midst of Jerusalem.

Q5: In Verses 4 + 5, When will Old men, women and children fill the streets of Jerusalem? Read Isa 65:20-22 A5: 22"For as the lifetime of a tree, so will be the days of My people, And My chosen ones will wear out the work of their hands.

Q6: In Verses 6, What is the answer to **the Lord's**, Rhetorical Question, about "**it**" the reclaiming of

Mt. Zion being "too difficult" for "the remnant of this people (Israel) in those days" Read Jer 32:17 A6: "Nothing is too difficult for You" Jer 32:17, "declares the LORD of hosts (the Father), Zech 8:6 "the remnant of this people" refers to: the portion or remnant of Nation of Israel alive in those days", meaning "those days" when the Lord returns to Zion/Jerusalem and "saves" His People Israel and brings them back to Jerusalem and they will be the Lord's people and the Lord will be their God, Zech 8:6-8

Q7: In Verse 7, what 4 Things will the LORD do ?

A7: I (the Father), am going to >

(1) save My people from the land of the east and from the land of the west. (from everywhere)

(2) I will bring them (Israel) back and they (Israel) will live in the midst of Jerusalem;

(3) and they (Israel) shall be My people,

(4) and I will be their (Israel's) God in truth and righteousness.'

Read Ezek 37:21-28, [All in the Millennial Kingdom] Other Passages: Isa 11:11-12, Isa 27:12-13, Amos 9:11-15

Read Paragraph > Zechariah 8:9–13

Do not Fear, Let your hands be strong Israel, You will be Saved and Blessed

XX. Do not Fear, Let your hands be strong Israel, You will be Saved and Blessed, 8:9–13, ¶ (Dec 7th) (518BC)

- A. 9 "Thus says the LORD of hosts (the Father), 'Let your (Israel's) hands be strong, 8:13d
 - 1. you (Israel) who are listening in these days to these words from the mouth of the prophets,
 - 2. those (prophets) who spoke in the day
 - a. that the foundation of the house of the LORD of hosts was laid,
 - b. to the end that the temple might be built.
- B. 10 'For (Because) before those days there was <u>no wage</u> for <u>man</u> or <u>any wage</u> for <u>animal</u>;
 - 1. and for him who went out or came in there was <u>no peace</u> because of his enemies,
 - 2. and I (the Father) set all men one against another.
- C. 11 'But now I will not treat the remnant of this people (Israel) as in the former days,'
 - a. declares the LORD of hosts (the Father).
 - 1. 12 'For (Because) there will be <u>peace</u> for the seed:
 - 2. **the vine** will <u>yield</u> its <u>fruit</u>,
 - 3. the land will <u>yield</u> its produce and
 - the heavens will give their dew;
 - 5. and I will cause the remnant of this people (Israel) to inherit all these things.
- D. 13 'It will (in future) come about that
 - 1. just as (same way) you (Israel) were a curse among the nations,
 - 2. O house of Judah and house of Israel,
 - 3. so (Reason) I will save you (both) (WHY?) that you may become a blessing.
 - 4. <u>**Do not</u>** fear; let **your** (Israel's) hands be strong.' 8:9a</u>

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 8:9–13

Do not Fear, Let your hands be strong Israel, You will be Saved and Blessed

The TIME is still Dec 7th, **518 BC**, and **Ezra's Temple** is still under construction, until **515 BC**.

In Zech 7:11-14, the Lord spoke of His Judgement on Israel, But In Zech 8:1-8 He speaks of Blessing.

In Zech 8:1-8, The LORD, will return to Zion and will dwell in the midst of Jerusalem, with His People. Now the Lord further speaks of Israel's Future Blessings and being Saved.

Q1: In Verse 9, WHO are the Prophets who spoke in the day that the foundation of the house of the LORD of hosts was laid, to the end that the temple might be built. Read Ezra 5:1-2

A1: "the prophets, Haggai and Zechariah", 2 years BEFORE when they began Building Temple, in 520BC Q2: In Verse 10, WHAT 3 Things were the Problem, BEFORE those days, of starting to Build the Temple ? A2: (1) there was no wage for man or animal; (2) there was no peace because of his enemies,

(3) (the Father) <u>set all men against each another</u>. ALL Explained in Hag 1:6-11, in **520BC** Q3: In Verse 11 + 12, the word "**But**" contrasts with, what was said in Verse 10.

So HOW will **the Lord <u>NOT</u>** treat the **remnant** of **this people** (Israel) as in the **former days**. A3: (1) there will be <u>peace</u> for **the seed**, (2) **the vine** will <u>yield</u> its <u>fruit</u>, (3) **the land** will <u>yield</u> its <u>produce</u>

(4) and the heavens will give their dew; (5) the Lord will cause (Israel) to inherit all these things.
 Q4: In Verse 13, WHAT will come about in the Future, concerning Cursing and Blessing, of Israel ?
 A4: (1) in the (same way) (Israel) was a Curse among the nations, the Lord will Save (both) S. Judah

and N. Israel. (WHY?) that Nation of Israel may become a blessing.

Q5: WHY was Israel Cursed in the first Place? Read Deut 28:15, 20, 25, 36, 45, 48, 49

A5: "if you <u>do not obey</u> (Sin) the LORD your God", "all these Curses will come upon you", Deut 28:15 Q6: Are Curses in the Bible <u>Permanent</u> or NOT? Explain?

A5: Curse of Ground Given, Gen 3:17, Removed. Gen 8:21. Curse of the Law, Removed, Gal 3:10-14, Curse of Death, Gen 1:17, Removed, Rev 22:3. Curse of Creation, Rom 8:19, Removed, Hos 2:18, Isa 11:6

Read Paragraph > Zechariah 8:14–17

As I, the LORD, purposed to do harm to you, so now I purposed to do good to you, Israel Working Outline > Zechariah 8:14–17 (Paragraphs ¶ from NAS Bible)

XXI. As I <u>purposed</u> to do harm to you, so now I <u>purposed</u> to do good to you, 8:14–17, ¶ (Dec 7th) (518BC)

- A. 14 "For thus says the LORD of hosts (the Father).
 - 1. 'Just as I purposed to do harm to you (Israel)
 - a. when your fathers (Israel's) provoked Me to wrath,' says the LORD of hosts,
 - i. 'and I have <u>not **relented**</u> (in doing harm),
- B. 15 so I (the LORD) have again purposed in these days
 - 1. <u>to do good</u> to Jerusalem and to the house of Judah.
 - 2. Do not fear!
- C. 16 'These are the things which you should do:
 - 1. <u>speak the truth</u> to one another;
 - 2. judge with truth and
 - 3. judgment for (make) peace in your gates.
 - 4. 17 'Also let none of you devise evil in your heart against another,
 - 5. and <u>do not love **perjury**</u> (lie under oath);
 - a. for (Because) all these (things) are what I hate,' declares the LORD."

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 8:14–17

As I, the LORD, purposed to do harm to you, so now I purposed to do good to you, Israel The TIME is still Dec 7th, 518 BC, and Ezra's Temple is still under construction, until 515 BC. In Zech 7:11-14, the Lord spoke of His Judgement on Israel, But In Zech 8:1-8 He speaks of Blessing. In Zech 8:1-8, The LORD, will return to Zion and will dwell in the midst of Jerusalem, with His People. In Zech 8:14–17, The LORD, will purpose in these days to do good to Jerusalem and to the house of Judah.

Q1: In Verses 14 + 15, WHAT did the Lord purpose to do BEFORE and THEN purpose in these days of Israel ? A1: the Lord purposed to do harm, to you (Israel) BEFORE THEN in these days > the Lord purposed to do good, to Jerusalem and to the house of Judah

Q2: In Verses 16 + 17, WHAT "things" should Israel do, according to the Lord ? A2: (1) speak the truth to one another; (2) judge with truth and (3) (make) peace in your gates. (4) let none of you devise evil in your heart against another, (5) do Not love perjury (lie under oath)

Q3: In Verse 17, WHAT is the REASON Given by the Lord for <u>NOT Doing</u>, these last 2 things ? A3: (Because) all these (things) are what I hate,' declares the LORD."

Read Paragraph > Zechariah 8:19–23

Your Fasts will be turned to Joy and Feasts, All Nations will seek the Lord

XXII. Your Fasts will be turned to Joy and Feasts, All Nations will seek the Lord, 8:19–23, ¶ (Dec 7th) (518BC)

- A. 19 "Thus (in this way) says the LORD of hosts (the Father),
- B. 'The **fast** of the **fourth**, ... of the **fifth**, ... of the **seventh** and ... of the **tenth** months
 - (the fasts) will become (future) joy, gladness, and cheerful feasts for the house of Judah;
 a. so love truth and peace.' 8:16
- C. 20 "Thus (in this way) says the LORD of hosts,
 - 1. 'It will yet be (future) that peoples will come, even the inhabitants of many cities.
- D. 21 'The inhabitants of one (city) will go to another (city), saying,
 - 1. "Let us (men) go at once to entreat (earnestly request) the favor of the LORD, 8:22
 - 2. and to **seek the LORD of hosts**; I (myself) will also **go**."
- E. 22 'So (Reason) many peoples and mighty nations will (future)
 - 1. come to seek the LORD of hosts in Jerusalem
 - 2. and to entreat the favor of the LORD.' 8:21
- F. 23 "Thus (in this way) says the LORD of hosts,
 - In those days ten men from all the nations will grasp the garment of a Jew, saying,
 a. "Let us (men) go with you (Jews), for we (men) have heard that God is with you (Jews)."

Questions of the Text: Zechariah 8:19–23

Your Fasts will be **turned** to **Joy** and **Feasts**, **All Nations** will **seek the Lord** The TIME is still Dec 7th, **518 BC**, and **Ezra's Temple** is still under construction, until **515 BC**. In Zech 7:11-14, **the Lord** spoke of **His Judgement** on **Israel**,

But In Zech 8:1-8 He speaks of Blessing

and in Zech 8:14–17, The LORD, will <u>purpose</u> to do <u>good</u> to Jerusalem and to the house of Judah. The LORD waited till now to answer the question raised by the <u>Bethel delegates</u> (7:2–3) about the commemorative <u>4 fasts they</u> had been doing for the last 70 years. Commemorating the siege and capture of Jerusalem by <u>Nebuchadnezzar</u>. These <u>fasts</u> are still observed by some Jews today. But at <u>the Lord's</u> <u>Second Coming</u> these <u>fasts</u> will be turned into <u>feasts</u>, as part of Joy in the <u>Millennium</u>. See Study on Zech 7

Q1: In Verses 20 + 21 + 22, WHAT Things, in the Future, will the Peoples of the Nations, come to do ? A1: the peoples will come, to entreat (earnestly request) the favor of the LORD,

and to seek the LORD of hosts;

Q2: In Verse 23, WHAT will the men, in the Future, of All Nations do, concerning the Jews ? A2: In those days (when men seek the Lord, in Jerusalem, 8:22)

ten men from all the nations will grasp the garment of a Jew, saying,

"Let us (men) go with you (Jews),

for we (men) have heard that God is with you (Jews)." [Want what Jews have]

The Nation of Israel

Zech 8:13, WHAT will come about in the Future, concerning Cursing and Blessing, of Israel ? (1) in the (same way) (Israel) was a Curse among the nations, the Lord will Save (both) S. Judah and N. Israel. (WHY?) that the Nation of Israel may become a Blessing.

Zech 8:15, (the LORD) will **purpose,** in these days, to do Good to Jerusalem and to the house of Judah.
