Our Approach to the Study of Covenants

We are studying the Covenants for ourselves. [Not adopting an existing Theology on Covenants]
We are starting in Genesis and working forward through the Old Testament to understand
how they are Chronologically and Progressively Revealed and how each Covenant builds on
or does not build on each previous Covenant.

The **COVENANT Definition – Update One**

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COVENANT of GOD. A Promise of God, always <u>initiated</u> and <u>established</u> by God, Gen 6:18, 9:9, 11, 17 <u>between</u> God and a Person, a People Group, or all Living things, Gen 9:10, Gen 9:17, according to His Plan, Purpose and Will.

COVENANT of **GOD**. as "**Promises**", often with "**I will**" or "**I shall**" statements, that "will come to pass". IF the **Covenant** specified certain binding <u>conditions</u> for **God** to fulfill both parties' obligations

then it was considered a Unilateral or Un-Conditional Covenant.

IF the Covenant specified certain binding conditions for God to fulfill, God's Part, and separate conditions for Man to fulfill, Man's Part,

then it was considered a Bi-lateral or Conditional Covenant.

COVENANT of GOD, often has offered burnt (killed) offerings, Gen 8:20, Gen 22:2, Rom 8:3

COVENANT of GOD, often has "a sign" to "remember" or to identify with, that Covenant, Gen 9:12

COVENANT of GOD, is often identified as an "everlasting covenant", Gen 9:16, Gen 17:7, Jer 32:40

What we learned so far about the Abrahamic Covenant Promises

The Calling of Abram – in Ur of the Chaldeans, Gen 12:1, Acts 7:2-3


The Sending of Abram – in Ur of the Chaldeans to Go to the Land of Canaan, Gen 11:31, 12:5

The Promise of Making of Abram, into a great nation with a great name, Gen 12:2

The Promise of Blessing of Abram, Gen 12:2

The Promise of Blessing of all the families of the earth, will be in Abram, Gen 12:3

The Promise of: The Lord giving the Land to Abram, and his Physical Descendants, Gen 12:7



Historical Background - to establish Context From initial Covenant of Abram, Gen 12:1-9, to separation of Lot from Abram, Gen 12:1-9 Read Genesis 12:10-20 Abram's Bad Idea 10 Now there was a famine in the land (Canaan); so Abram went down to Egypt to sojourn there, for the famine was severe in the land (Canaan). (Severe famine in the land (Canaan) Gen 26:1, 43:1 11 It came about when he came near to Egypt, that he said to Sarai his wife, "See now, I know that you are a beautiful woman; 12 and when the **Egyptians** see you, they will say, 'This is his wife'; and they will kill me, but they will let you live. Gen 20:11, 26:7 13 "Please say that you are my sister so that it may go well with me because of you, and that I may live on account of you." 14 It came about when Abram came into Egypt, the Egyptians saw that the woman was very beautiful. 15 Pharaoh's officials saw her and praised her to Pharaoh; and the woman was taken into Pharaoh's house. **16** Therefore **he** treated **Abram** well for her sake; and gave him sheep and oxen and donkeys and male and female servants and female donkeys and camels. 17 But the Lord struck Pharaoh and his house with great plagues because of Sarai, Abram's wife. 18 Then Pharaoh called Abram and said, "What is this you have done to me? Gen 26:10 Why did you not tell me that she was your wife? 19 "Why did you say, 'She is my sister,' so that I took her for my wife? Now then, here is your wife, take her and go." 20 Pharaoh commanded his men concerning him; and they escorted him away, with his wife and all that belonged to him. Abram's Bad Idea, to give away his wife Notice: There was a Famine in Canaan, Gen 12:10 later there was a Famine in Canaan for Isaac, Gen 26:1 later there was a Famine in Canaan for Jacob, Gen 43:1 Notice: Abram goes down to Egypt to sojourn there (temporarily live), Gen 12:10 later Jacob or sons of Israel go down to Egypt to sojourn (temporarily live), Gen 43:1 Notice: Abram tells his beautiful wife Sarai to say she is his sister, Gen 12:13 later Abram says Sarai is his sister a second time, to Abimelech King of Philistines, Gen 20:2, 20:12 later Isaac says his beautiful wife Rebekah, is his sister, Gen 26:7

Notice: **Pharaoh** takes **Sarai**, **Abram's** wife, and gives **him** much livestock and servants as gifts, **Gen 12:16 Abram** was very rich, in livestock, in silver, in gold, **Gen 13:2**

later Isaac reaped a hundred-fold, became rich, with flocks and great household, Gen 26:12-14 later Moses or Israel, left Egypt with much plunder, livestock, and mixed multitude, Ex 12:35-36, 38 But the Lord struck Pharaoh and his house with great plagues, because of Sarai, Gen 12:17

later for Isaac, God told Abimelech, because of Rebekah, he was a dead man, Gen 20:3
later for Moses or Israel, the Lord struck Pharaoh and his house with great plagues, Ex 7:14-12:36
because Pharaoh had the Lord's wife, the sons of Israel, Jer 31:32

Notice:

Abram has Sarai lie about her being his wife, Gen 20:12, but she was his half-sister, Gen 20:12-13

The Lord's plan for Sarai (barren, Gen 11:30) to have a son by Abram and not by Hagar, Gen 17:15-21

But the Lord intervenes and strikes Pharaoh and his house with great plagues, because of Sarai.

The great plagues here mirror Moses's later great plagues in Egypt, Ex 7:14-12:36

Also Abram comes away from Pharaoh rich as Moses and Israel did when they left Egypt, Ex 12:35-36, 38

Historical Background – to establish Context

Read Genesis 13:1-13

1 So Abram went up from Egypt to the Negev (desert, S. Israel),

he and his wife and all that belonged to him, and Lot with him.

2 Now Abram was very rich in livestock, in silver and in gold. Gen 12:16

3 He went on his journeys from the Negev as far as Bethel,

to the place where his tent had been at the beginning, between Bethel and Ai, Gen 12:8

4 to the place of the altar which he had made there formerly; Gen 12:8

and there Abram called on the name of the Lord. Gen 12:8

5 Now Lot, who went with Abram, also had flocks and herds and tents.

6 And the land could not sustain them while dwelling together,

for their possessions were so great that they were not able to remain together. (rich, Gen 13:2)

7 And there was strife between the herdsmen of Abram's livestock and the herdsmen of Lot's livestock.

Now the Canaanite and the Perizzite were dwelling then in the land. Gen 12:6

8 So Abram said to Lot, "Please let there be no strife between you and me,

nor between my herdsmen and your herdsmen, for we are brothers.

9 "Is not the whole land before you? Please separate from me;

if to the left, then I will go to the right; or if to the right, then I will go to the left."

10 Lot lifted up his eyes and saw all the valley of the Jordan, that it was well watered everywhere this was before the Lord destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah— Gen 19:24

like the garden of the Lord, like the land of Egypt as you go to Zoar. (Zoar, Gen 19:22)

11 So Lot chose for himself all the valley of the Jordan, and Lot journeyed eastward.

Thus they separated from each other.

12 Abram settled in the land of Canaan,

while Lot settled in the cities of the valley, and moved his tents as far as Sodom.

13 Now the men of Sodom were wicked exceedingly and sinners against the Lord. Gen 18:20

Abram's separation from Lot, Abram in Canaan, and Lot in Sodom

Notice: Abram returns to Bethel the area he was before and the altar there, Gen 13:3

Notice: Abram and Lot decide to quit living in the same part of the Land of Canaan, Gen 13:5-9

Notice: Lot decides to move "eastward" to the "well watered" "valley of the Jordan"

Which valley was "like the garden of the Lord"

Q1: Is "all the valley of the Jordan, well watered everywhere" today?

A1: No, near **Dead Sea** it is hot and barren with pillars of salt or sulfur everywhere today.

Notice: "the men of Sodom were wicked exceedingly and sinners against the Lord", Gen 13:13

Sodom and Gomorrah, as part of Canaan, were first mentioned back in Gen 10:19.

Their wickedness is described in detail in Gen 18:20, Ezk 16:49-50, Lk 17:28, 2 Peter 2:7-8, Jude 7

GOD'S COVENANT WITH ABRAHAM AND HIS DESCENDANTS - PART 2

Read Genesis 13:14-18

- I. 14 The Lord said to Abram, after Lot had separated from him,
 - A. "Now lift up your eyes and look from the place where you are,
 - 1. northward and southward and eastward and westward;
 - B. 15 for all the land which you see, (Moses, Deut 34:1-4)
 - 1. I will give it (the land) to you and to your descendants forever. Gen 17:8, 2 Chron 20:7
 - C. 16 "I will make your descendants as the dust of the earth, 22:17, 28:14
 - 1. so that (Reason) if anyone can number the dust of the earth,
 - a. then your descendants can also be numbered.
- II. 17 "Arise, walk about the land through its length and breadth;
 - A. for I will give it (the land) to you." Gen 17:8, 2 Chron 20:7
- III. 18 Then Abram moved his tent and came and dwelt by the oaks of Mamre, Gen 12:6
 - A. which (Oaks) are in **Hebron**,
 - B. and there (at Oaks) he built an altar to the Lord.

Abram was shown by the Lord, the Land of Canaan as far as he could see.

The Lord said to Abram, "Now lift up your eyes and look from the place where you are, northward and southward and eastward and westward, Gen 13:14

The Promise of giving Abram and his descendants all the Land of Canaan forever

I will give it (the land) to you and to your descendants forever, Gen 13:15
I will give it (the land) to you, Gen 13:17

The Promise of Abram descendants being innumerable, as dust of the Earth

I will make your descendants as the dust of the earth, 22:17, 28:14 so that (Reason) if anyone can number the dust of the earth, then your descendants can also be numbered.

Q1: In verse 15, How Long will Abram's (physical) descendants inherit the Land of Canaan for?

A1:

Read Gen 17:8

Q2: How Long will Abram's (physical) descendants inherit the Land of Canaan for, in Gen 17:8?

A2:

Read 2 Chron 20:7 and Isa 60:21

Q3: How Long will Abram's (physical) descendants inherit the Land of Canaan for, in 2 Chron 20:7?
A3:

Q4: If Israel is scattered and not fully in the Land now, how will they inherit the Land forever?

Read Jer 32:37-42

A4a:

"Behold, I will gather them out of all the lands to which I have driven them in My anger, in My wrath and in great indignation; and I will bring them back to this place and make them dwell in safety. 32:37

Read Ezek 37:21-28

A4b:


"Say to them, 'Thus says the Lord GOD, "Behold, I will take the sons of Israel from among the nations where they have gone, and I will gather them from every side and bring them into their own land; 37:21

Notice:

the Lord gives the land to Abram's (physical descendants, offspring, seed) Gen 13:15, 13:17 and Not to all the families (Nations) of the earth.

Abram dies without ever receiving the Land, but he was buried in the Promised Land, Gen 23:17-20.

Abram moved his tent and came and dwelt by the oaks of Mamre, as he did before, Gen 12:6 which (Oaks) are in Hebron, and there (at Oaks) he built an altar to the Lord, as he did before, Gen 12:7
