THE LORD'S - COVENANTS OF PROMISE

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Our Approach to the Study of Covenants

We are studying the **Covenants** for ourselves. [Not adopting an existing Theology on Covenants] We are starting in Genesis and working forward through the Old Testament to understand how **they** are **Chronologically** and **Progressively Revealed** and how each **Covenant** builds on or does not build on each previous **Covenant**.

The COVENANT Definition – Update Two

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COVENANT of GOD. A Promise of God, always <u>initiated</u> and <u>established</u> by God, Gen 6:18, 9:9, 11, 17 <u>between</u> God and a Person, a People Group, or all Living things, Gen 9:10, Gen 9:17,

according to His Plan, Purpose, and Will.

COVENANT of **GOD**, as "**Promises**", often with "I will" or "I shall" statements, that "will come to pass". IF the **Covenant** specified certain binding <u>conditions</u> for **God** to fulfill both parties' obligations

then it was considered a Unilateral or Un-Conditional Covenant.

IF the Covenant specified certain binding conditions for God to fulfill, God's Part,

and separate conditions for Man to fulfill, Man's Part,

then it was considered a Bi-lateral or Conditional Covenant.

COVENANT of GOD, often has offered burnt (killed) offerings, Gen 8:20, Gen 22:2, Ex 24:5, Rom 8:3 COVENANT of GOD, often has "a sign" to "remember" or to identify with, that Covenant, Gen 9:12 COVENANT of GOD, is often identified as an "everlasting (perpetual) covenant", Gen 9:16, Gen 17:7, Jer 32:40 COVENANT of GOD, may be Ratified with Blood, Ex 24:5-8, Gal 3:15-17, Heb 9:15-22, 13:20 COVENANT of GOD, may be Ratified by passing between cut animals, Gen 15:10, 17, Jer 34:18 COVENANT of GOD, may be Ratified by Swearing and/or by Oath, Gen 26:3, 50:24, Num 14:15–16, Deut 7:6–9, Deut 9:5, 29:9–15, 1 Chron 16:13–18, Ps 105:6–11, Jer 11:1–5, Ezek 16:59–60, Lk 1:67–74, Acts 2:29–31, Heb 6:16–18

Working Outline > Exodus 24:1–8 (Paragraph ¶ from NAS Bible)

At Mount Sinai, the Covenant is Told, Agreed To, Written, and Ratified in Blood Read Exodus 24:1–8

- I. 1 Then He said to Moses, "Come up (Mt. Sinai) to the Lord,
 - A. you and Aaron, Nadab and Abihu and seventy of the elders of Israel (Num 11:16, 25),
 1. and you (all) shall worship at a distance.
 - B. 2 "Moses alone, however, shall come near to the Lord,
 - 1. but they shall not come near,
 - 2. nor shall the people come up with him."
- II. 3 Then Moses came and recounted (told) to the people
 - A. all the words of the Lord and all the ordinances; 19:1–23:33
 - B. and **all the people** answered with one voice and said,
 - 1. "All the words which the Lord has spoken we will do!" 19:8, 24:7
- III. 4 Moses wrote down all the words of the Lord. Deut 31:9
- IV. Then he arose early in the morning, and built an altar at the foot of the mountain
 - A. (altar) with twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel.
- V. 5 He sent young men of the sons of Israel,
 - 1. and they (who) offered burnt offerings Lev 1:3, 13, 17
 - 2. and **sacrificed young bulls** as **peace offerings** to **the Lord**.
- VI. 6 Moses took half of the blood (of bulls) and put it in basins,
 - A. and the other half of the blood he sprinkled on the altar. Lev 1:5, 11
- VII. 7 Then he took the book of the covenant and read it in the hearing of the people;
 - A. and they said, "All that the Lord has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient!" 19:8, 24:3
- VIII. 8 So Moses took the blood (of basins) and sprinkled it on the people, and said, Heb 9:18-22, 1 Pet 1:2 A. "Behold the blood of the covenant,
 - 1. which the Lord has made with you (people)
 - a. in accordance with all these words (of the Lord)."
- **Q1:** Where are **all those persons**, to **worship** from, that are "to <u>come up</u> to **the Lord"**, in verses 1-2 ?
- A1: (1) Aaron, Nadab and Abihu and the 70 elders of Israel ? shall worship at a distance + not come near
 - (2) Moses? shall <u>come near</u> (3) the people? <u>nor</u> shall the people <u>come up</u> Mt. with Moses

Overview of Events, Exodus 24:1–8

Then Moses tells the people, at the foot of the mountain,

all the words of the Lord and all the ordinances, given in 20:1–23:33

all the people answered with one voice and said,

"All the words which the Lord has spoken we will do!" 19:8, 24:7

Then Moses writes down all the words of the Lord, in the book of the covenant, 24:4 Then Moses built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with 12 pillars, for the 12 tribes of Israel, 24:4 Then Moses sends young men of Israel,

(who) offered burnt offerings and sacrificed young bulls as peace offerings, 24:5, Lev 1:3, 13, 17 Then Moses put half the blood (of bulls) in basins, and the other half he sprinkled on the altar, 24:6, Lev 1:5, 11 Then Moses took the book of the covenant and read it in the hearing of the people, 24:7 Then the people said, "All that the Lord has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient !" 24:7, 19:8, 24:3 Then Moses took the blood (of basins) and sprinkled it on the people, Read Heb 9:18-22

and said, "Behold the blood of the covenant, which the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words (of the Lord)." (Commands, 20:1-17, Ordinances, 21:1-23:33)

Working Outline > Exodus 24:9–11 (Paragraph ¶ from NAS Bible)

Moses with 73 others, went up Mount Sinai, and saw the God of Israel Read Exodus 24:9–11

I. 9 Then **Moses** went up (Mt. Sinai)

A. with Aaron, Nadab and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel (73 people), 24:1

B. 10 and they saw the God of Israel; 24:11, Gen 16:13, 32:30, Isa 6:1, 5, Ezek 1:1, Num 12:8,

1. and under His feet there appeared to be a pavement of sapphire, Ex 24:17, Ezek 1:26, 10:1 a. as clear as the sky itself., Rev 4:6, 21:8

2. 11 Yet He did not stretch out His hand against the nobles of the sons of Israel;

C. and they saw God, 24:10,

1. and they <u>ate</u> and <u>drank</u>.

Can Man see God or Can Man Not see God?

Hagar saw God, Gen 16:13, even remained alive after seeing Him Jacob saw God, Gen 32:30, Face to Face, yet my life has been preserved Isaiah saw God, Isaiah 6:1, 5, For my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts Ezekiel saw visions of God, Ezek 1:1, the heavens were opened and I saw visions of God. Moses spoke to God Face to Face, Ex 33:11, just as a man speaks to his friend Moses spoke to God, Read Ex 33:18–23, "I pray You (Lord), show me Your glory!" "I Myself will make all My goodness (glory) pass before you, Ex 33:19 "You cannot see My face, for no man can see Me and live !", Ex 33:20

while My glory is passing by,

I will put you in the cleft of the rock and cover you with My hand, until I have passed by, Ex 33:22 "Then I will take My hand away and you shall see My back, Ex 33:23 but My face shall not be seen." Ex 33:23

Conclusion:

I don't think anyone has seen God's Face and lived, 33:20

but Moses saw God's back and lived, 33:23

and Moses spoke to God Face to Face, 33:11, but Moses didn't see God Face to Face

As far as **speaking** to **God Face** to **Face**,

I think this referring to a direct conversation with **another person**, in **one's** presence, "just as a **man speaks** to **his friend**", Ex 33:11, Gen 32:30

In this instance, 33:11, the phrase "Face to Face" is a figure of speech indicating they were in each other's presence, but not in each other's sight.

Jesus was God in the flesh (John 1:1, 1:14) so when people saw Him, they were seeing God.

So, yes, God can be "<u>seen</u>" and many people have "<u>seen</u>" God.

At the same time, **no one** has ever <u>seen</u> **God** revealed in all **His glory**.

In our fallen human condition, if God were to fully reveal Himself to us, we would be consumed and destroyed.

Working Outline > Exodus 24:12–18 (Paragraph ¶ from NAS Bible)

Moses called up Mount Sinai, for stone tablets, with the law and the commandment Read Exodus 24:12–18

- I. 12 Now the Lord said to Moses,
 - A. "Come up to Me on the mountain and remain there,
 - B. and I will give you the stone tablets with the law and the commandment1. which I have written for their instruction."
- II. 13 So Moses arose with Joshua his servant, and Moses went up to the mountain of God.
 - A. 14 But to the elders he (Moses) said, "Wait here for us (Moses, Joshua) until we return to you.
 - 1. And behold, Aaron and Hur are with you;
 - whoever has a legal matter, let him approach them."

III. 15 Then Moses went up to the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. Ex 19:9

- A. 16 The glory of the Lord rested on Mount Sinai, Ex 16:10, 14:10
 - 1. and the cloud <u>covered</u> it for six days;
- B. and on the seventh day He called to Moses from the midst of the cloud. Ps 99:7
- IV. 17 And to the eyes of the sons of Israel the appearance of the glory of the Lord
 - A. was like a consuming fire on the mountain top. Ex 3:2, Deut 4:24, 9:3, Heb 12:29
- V. 18 Moses entered the midst of the cloud as he went up to the mountain;
 - A. and Moses was on the mountain forty days and forty nights. Deut 9:9

Moses is told to come up to the Lord on Mount Sinai and he went up, 24:12, 13, 15, 18

Q1: In verse 12, What was the Lord to give Moses when he was up on the mountain ? A1: the stone tablets > with the law and the commandment, written for their instruction. The people's instruction, helps to see the purpose of the law and the commandment

The Stone Tablets > and the writing on the tablets

tablets called "the tablets of testimony", Ex 31:18, 32:15 tablets called "the tablets of the covenant", Deut 9:9 two tablets, Deut 5:22, were made of stone, Deut 5:22, 9:9 Ex 31:18 the tablets contain the words of the covenant, the Ten Commandments, Ex 34:28, Deut 4:13 tablets "written by the finger of God", Ex 31:18, tablets "the writing was God's writing engraved on the tablets", Ex 32:16 tablets were written on both sides, Ex 32:15, (assume 2 or 3 commands per tablet side)

Two sets of Tablets

1st time, Moses was on the mountain forty days and forty nights, no bread or water, Deut 9:9
 1st set of tablets are given by God to Moses, God made and wrote, Ex 24:12, 31:18, but Moses shattered, 34:1
 Exodus 31:18

18 When He had finished speaking with him upon Mount Sinai,

He gave Moses the two tablets of the testimony, tablets of stone, written by the finger of God. Exodus 32:19, Deut 9:12-17

19 It came about, as soon as Moses came near the camp, that he saw the calf and the dancing; and Moses' anger burned, and he threw the tablets from his hands and shattered them at the foot of the mountain.

2nd time, Moses was on the mountain forty days and forty nights, Ex 34:28, no bread or water, Deut 9:18
2nd set of tablets are <u>cutout</u> by Moses like former ones, Ex 34:1, 4, and <u>written</u> by God, Ex 32:15-16, Deut 10:1-5
Exodus 34:28, Deut 9:18

28 So he was there with the Lord forty days and forty nights; he did not eat bread or drink water.

And he (Lord, Deut 10:2) wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant, the Ten Commandments.

The First Time Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

The Lord instructs Moses on How to Build a Tabernacle for Him, Exodus 25:1–31:18

- I. The Lord instructs Moses to Build a Tabernacle for Him, 25:1–31:18,
 - A. Construct a Sanctuary for Me, that I may dwell among them, 25:8 (Purpose for Tabernacle)
 - B. Construct According to all I show you, 25:9
 - 1. as the pattern of the **tabernacle** and of all **its furniture,** 25:9
 - C. Raise Contributions of **the materials** from every **man**, 25:1-7
 - D. Construct **The Ark** and **Mercy Seat**, 25:10–22
 - E. Make The Table for the bread, 25:23–30
 - F. Make The Lampstand, 25:31–40
 - G. Make Ten Curtains, 26:1–14
 - H. Make The Tabernacle Boards, 26:15–30
 - I. Make The Veils, 26:31–37
 - J. Make The Bronze Altar, 27:1–8
 - K. Make The Court of the Tabernacle, 27:9–19
 - L. Make The Oil for Lamps, from Olives, 27:20–21
 - M. Make The Holy Priests' Garments, 28:1–43
 - N. Consecrate The Priests to minister, 29:1–46
 - O. Make The Altar of Incense, 30:1–10
 - P. Give The Atonement Money, as a Ransom, 30:11–16

The Second Time Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

The Lord Renews the Covenant with Moses and Israel, Exodus 34:1-28

- 27 Then the Lord said to Moses, "Write down these words, (34:1-26)
 - for in accordance with these words I have made a covenant with you and with Israel." Ex 34:27

Moses has the People Construct the Tabernacle, Exodus 35:1–39:31

Moses Examines the finished Tabernacle and Blesses the People, Exodus 39:32-42

The Tabernacle Erection Instructions Given to Moses by the Lord, Exodus 40:1-16

Moses Erects the Tabernacle, Exodus 40:17-33

Moses begins to **Erect the Tabernacle, on** 1st day of 1st month (Nisan, Mar-Apr), Ex 40:2 **on** 1st day of 1st month of the 2nd year (after leaving Egypt, Ex 12:2, 13:5), Ex 40:17

The glory of the Lord filled the Tabernacle, Exodus 40:34–38

34 Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle.35 Moses was not able to enter the tent of meeting

because the cloud had settled on **it**, and **the glory of the Lord** filled **the tabernacle**. **36** Throughout all **their** journeys whenever **the cloud** was taken up from over **the tabernacle the sons of Israel** would set out;

37 but if the cloud was not taken up, then they did not set out until the day when it was taken up.
38 For throughout all their journeys, the cloud of the Lord was on the tabernacle by day,

and there was **fire** in **it** by **night**, in the sight of all **the house of Israel**.

Moses set before them, all these words which the Lord had commanded him in Ex 19:3-8.
(the Lord gives the Conditions of the Covenant) Ex 19:5
if you will indeed obey My voice, Ex 15:26, and keep My covenant
(the Lord gives the Commands of the Covenant) Ex 20:1-17
(the Lord gives the Provisions of the Covenant) Ex 19:6
then you shall be My own possession, among all the peoples
and you shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.
(All the people Promise to do the Commands of the Covenant) Ex 19:8
All the people answered, "All that the Lord has spoken we will do !", Ex 24:3, 24:7, Deut 5:27, 26:17
commanded in Ex 19:3-8.
(the Covenant is Ratified with Blood) Ex 24:1-8
(All the people Disobey the Covenant) Ex 32:1-6
(All the people Corrupt themselves, by worshiping idols, the Lord is angry) Ex 32:7-10
(Moses intercedes for the people, by entreating the Lord) Ex 32:1-6
(the Lord Renews the Covenant with the people) Ex 34:1-28

Mosaic Covenant – Ex 19:1 - 34:28
