Major Events that occur After a 1000 year Millennial Kingdom, Rev 20:7-15

- A. After 1000 years, Satan will be released from Abyss to deceive and gather Nations, 20:7-8
- B. Satan and Gog and Magog Nations and their armies surround Saints and Jerusalem, 20:9
 1. then Fire from Heaven consumes their armies, 20:9
- C. Satan is thrown into Lake of Fire to be tormented forever, 20:10
- D. Great White Throne for Christ set up and Earth and Heaven have fled away, 20:11
 - 1. Unbelievers from Death and Hades are Resurrected and Judged for their Deeds, 20:12-13
 - 2. This is the **2nd Death**, Judged Unbelievers are thrown into Lake of Fire, 20:14-15
- Satan Released, Gathers the Nations, the Nations devoured, and Satan to the Lake of Fire Working Outline > Read Revelation 20:7–10 (Paragraph ¶ from NAS Bible)

Revelation 20:7–10

 - 2. where the beast (Antichrist) and the false prophet are also;
 - G. and they (the 3) will be tormented day and night forever and ever. 14:10,

When the thousand years are completed, Rev 20:7a

"When the 1000 years are completed", Rev 20:2, 20:3, 20:4, 20:5, 20:6

The **1000 years began** after the **2**nd **Coming of Christ**, Rev 20:1-6.

Now the 1000 years are completed

See Lesson 29 for all things concerning the Millennial Kingdom

Christ will be Reigning on His Throne in Jerusalem, on Mt. Zion, in Temple (Ezekiel's), Zech 6:12-13, 8:3, Isa 9:6-7, Jer 33:14-17, Luke 1:31–33, Isa 2:1–4, Micah 4:1–3, Ezek 34:22–24, 43:1-7,

Believers, in their New Spiritual Bodies, both Jew and Gentile, will reign with Christ, in Jerusalem.

Also, **12 Apostles** and **David** will be **reigning** on **thrones** with **Christ**, Matt 19:28, Jer 30:9, Ezk 37:24

The Nation of Israel, in their New Spiritual Bodies, will possess the Promised Land, as in Gen 15:18, 13:15.

Believers, in their Flesh and Bones, Lk 24:39, Not Killed during the 7 year Tribulation, will be there.

These **Believers** will have children, some will become **Believers**, and some will be **Unbelievers**.

Satan will be released from his prison (abyss), Rev 20:7b

Satan was thrown into the abyss for 1000 years, in Rev 20:3,

where it says "after these things he <u>must be</u> released for a short time", 20:3.

Now John says, "When the 1000 years are completed", 20:7, "Satan will be released from his prison (abyss)". The "Satan will be released", in Rev 20:7, fulfills "he (Satan) must be released for a short time", in Rev 20:3. The "he (Satan) must be released for a short time", in Rev 20:3, is fulfilled here in Rev 20:7-9. God's Plan from the beginning was to bind Satan for a 1000 years and then release him for a short time,

knowing Satan would deceive the Nations.

(he) (Satan) will come out to deceive the nations, Rev 20:8a

Once Satan is released from his prison, (he) will come out to deceive the nations Satan is "who deceives the whole world", Rev 12:9, and "deceived Eve by his craftiness", 2 Cor 11:3, 1 Tim 2:14. In Rev 20:3, Satan was imprisoned "so that he should Not deceive the Nations", and in Rev 20:8, Satan is released because "he must be released" again to deceive the Nations, Rev 20:3, and he is, Rev 20:10.

(he) (Satan) will deceive the nations, in the four corners of the earth, Rev 20:8b (Satan) will deceive the nations, which (nations) are in the four corners of the earth, 7:1, Ezek 7:2, the four corners of the earth, Rev 7:1, Mk 13:27, Isa 11:12, Ezek 7:2

"the **four corners** of the **earth**", means the farthest reaches, without exception, of every place on **earth**. This is a "**metaphor**", attributing something "not having real existence but representing some truth about a situation or other subject", Cambridge Dictionary Example: I traveled all **the four corners** of the world.

which (nations) are in the earth, Gog (a ruler) and Magog (a land), Rev 20:8c

These Nations after the 1000 years are completed are All the Nations of the Earth, called Gog and Magog. Gog is (a ruler/prince), "Gog of the land of Magog, the prince of Rosh, Meshech and Tubal", in Ezek 38:2, 39:1. Magog is (a Land/place), in Ezek 38:2.

Gog, the derivation of the word is uncertain. It probably refers to the ruler of the people who live in Magog. Magog was identified by Josephus as the land of the Scythians, the region N and NE of the Black Sea and E of the Caspian Sea (now Commonwealth of Independent States, 12 States, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Moldova, Russia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, and Uzbekistan. (Russia, Ukraine, and Kazakhstan). Rosh, the area of modern Iran and Meshech and Tubal, modern Turkey. adapted from Ryrie study Bible: (p. 1323)





The battle of **Gog** and **Magog** in Rev 20:7–9 is not the same as the battle in Ezekiel 38–39 The question has been raised as to whether this war in Rev 20:7–9 is the same one discussed in Ezekiel 38–39, where **Gog** and **Magog** are also mentioned (Ezek. 38:2). These are **two different battles**, for in the war

of Ezekiel 38–39 the armies come primarily from **the north** and involve only **a few nations** of **the earth**. But the battle in Revelation 20:7–9 will involve **all nations**, so armies will come from **all the earth**. There is little in the context of Ezekiel 38–39 that is similar to the battle in Revelation, as there is no mention of **Satan** or of millennial conditions. In Revelation 20:7 the context clearly places the battle at the end of or after

the **Millennium**, whereas the Ezekiel battle takes place in connection with **end-time events**. Why then is the expression "**Gog** and **Magog**" used by John? The Scriptures do not explain the expression. In Ezekiel 38 **Gog** was the **ruler** and **Magog** was the **people**, and both were in rebellion against **God** and were enemies of Israel. Certainly the armies here in Revelation 20:7–9 come in the same spirit of antagonism against **God** that is found in Ezekiel 38. adapted from *The Bible Knowledge Commentary: (Vol. 2, p. 981)*.

The battle of **Gog** and **Magog** in Ezekiel 38–39, not mentioned in the Book of Revelation It seems best to place Ezekiel's battle of **Gog** and **Magog** in the **Tribulation** period, in the first **3 1/2 years** of the **7 year** period. The attack will come when **Israel** is at peace (Ezek 38:8, 11). When **Israel's covenant** with the **Antichrist** is in effect at the beginning of **Daniel's** 70th Week (Dan 9:27a), **she** will be at peace. But after the **covenant** is broken at the middle of the **7 year** period, **Israel** will suffer tremendous persecution (Dan 9:27b; Matt 24:15–22). This will provide the time needed to bury the dead (Ezek 39:12–13) and to burn the weapons of war (Ezek 39:9–10). adapted from *The Bible Knowledge Commentary: (Vol. 1, p. 1300)*.

First > The battle of Gog and Magog (some Nations), in Ezek 38–39, in First Half of the 7 year Tribulation Second > The battle of Armageddon in Rev 19:17-21, Rev 16:13-16, at End of the 7 year Tribulation Third > The battle of Gog and Magog (All Nations), in Rev 20:7-10, After 1000 year Millennial Kingdom

Satan to gather them (nations) together for the war, Rev 20:8c

Satan gathers them (the nations) together for the war, here in Rev 20:8

Satan gathers from All Nations, those he has deceived into rebelling against Christ in Jerusalem and the number of them, those gathered, is like the sand of the (sea), an innumerable number, Ezek 38:9,
 The Battle of Armageddon, Rev 16:13-16, Rev 19:11-21, Joel 3:2, Joel 3:11-16

The Lord gathered/assembled the nations, by use of demons, in Rev 16:13-16, at His 2nd Coming, Rev 19:11-21. Therefore, the nations were gathered to battle, before the 1000 year Millennium.

The Battle of Gog and Magog, Rev 20:8-9

Satan gathers the nations, in Rev 20:8, after his release from the 1000 years in the abyss.

Therefore, **the nations** were gathered to battle, after the **1000 year Millennium**.

Those who will follow **Satan** are some of the **children** of those **Believers**, who survive the **7 year Tribulation** and enter the **Millennium** in **their natural bodies**. These **Believers** will have **children**, some will become **Believers**, and some will be **Unbelievers** and **they** will repopulate **the earth**, Isa 65:18-25. Although it will be an ideal time of **peace** and great **prosperity** with **Christ reigning** on in **Jerusalem**

many will not believe as to be saved.

This is like the Nation of Israel, God's People, in the wilderness who had the angel of the Lord (Jesus) in the pillar of cloud leading them and His actual presence as God with them, in the tabernacle, Ex 40:34-38, 2 Sam 7:6, continuously and yet complained, rebelled, and worshiped other God's, 1 Sam 8:8, Deut 9:24.

This is like the Nation of Israel, God's People, in the Gospels when God in the Flesh was with them, Matt 1:23, and yet they did not believe He was the son of God with them, John 19:7.

I think the Millennial Kingdom is a time when God shows mankind, that even in a time of great peace, justice, prosperity, and God with them, mankind will suppress the truth in unrighteousness, Rom 1:18-23.

There is None Righteous, None who Understands, None who does Good, Rom 3:9-18, Ps 14:1-3, Ps 53:1-3.

The nations come up and surrounded the camp of the saints and the beloved city, Rev 20:9a Then they, All the nation's armies gathered by Satan, came up on the broad plain or entire breath of the earth from all parts of the world, 20:8, to make war, 20:8, with the saints and the beloved city. Remember "All the land (the promised land) will be changed into a plain, but Jerusalem will rise and remain on its site", Zech 14:10 or "will be raised above the hills", Isa 2:2. Then they, All the nation's armies on the plain, surround the camp (temporary dwelling place), Deut 23:14, of the saints and (surround) the beloved city (Jerusalem), on "the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob", Isa 2:3. the saints, (the holy ones), those in fine linen, Rev 19:13, those martyred/resurrected, Rev 20:4, those who receive and possess the Kingdom, Dan 7:18, Dan 7:22, Jer 3:17. the beloved city (Jerusalem), the place the Lord loves, Ps 87:2 "For the Lord has chosen Zion; He has desired it for His habitation", Ps 132:13
 fire came down from heaven and devoured the nations, Rev 20:9b Then fire came down from heaven and devoured them (nations), All the nation's armies on the plain, that surround Mt. Zion and Jerusalem, where the saints and Jesus dwell in Ezekiel's Temple. Fire came down from heaven, like in 2 Kings 1:10-14, Ps 11:6, Ezek 38:22, 39:6, Gen 19:24, Lk 9:54, Rev 14:10 The enemies of God are destroyed directly by His hand, by fire, protecting His People from Satan and his armies of the Earth, like the unrighteous in Sodom and Gomorrah, in Gen 19:24. All the armies gathered after the Millennium, are destroyed by fire, Rev 20:9. All the armies gathered before the Millennium, at Jesus' 2nd Coming, were destroyed by the sword out of the mouth of Jesus, and eaten by birds, Rev 19:21.
the devil was thrown into the lake of fire and brimstone , Rev 20:10 After all the armies of the Nations were burned up by the Lord , " the devil who deceived them (All the nations)". The deceiver , as said in Rev 12:9, 20:3, 20:10, Gen 3
the devil was thrown into the lake of fire and brimstone (burning sulfur). where the beast (Antichrist) and the false prophet are also; Rev 19:20 and they (the 3) will be tormented day and night forever and ever . 14:10

Who is thrown into the lake of fire and brimstone? Chart
First: the beast (Antichrist) and the false prophet, are thrown into the lake of fire, 19:20
Second: Satan, the devil, was thrown into the lake of fire, 20:10
Third: Death and Hades (the abode of the Dead), are thrown into the lake of fire, 20:14
Fourth: "If anyone worships the beast and his image, and receives a mark on his forehead or on his hand, he will be tormented with fire and brimstone
in the presence of the holy angels and in the presence of the Lamb", Rev 14:9-10
Fifth: anyone whose name was not found in the book of life, was thrown into the lake of fire, 20:15
Those in the lake of fire, includes "All who dwell on the earth will worship him, everyone whose name has not been written from the foundation of the world in the book of life of the Lamb", Rev 13:8, Rev 17:8 "This is the second death, the lake of fire", Rev 20:14

Conclusion:

the beast (Antichrist), the false prophet, Satan, and All Unbelievers who worship anyone other than God, Ex 20:3-6, and whose names are Not in the book of life, of the Lamb, are thrown into the lake of fire.

the lake of fire is Not annihilation or going out of existence, as some teach, because the beast and the false prophet are still in the lake of fire, a 1000 years after they entered into it, Rev 19:20.

a great white throne and Him who sat upon it, Rev 20:11

Then John saw a great white throne and Him who sat upon it.

Both the Father and the Son are seen as on the throne in Heaven, Rev 4:2-6

but the Father gave the Son all judgment, because (Reason) He is the Son of Man, John 5:22-30, Acts 10:42 "For not even the Father judges anyone, but He has given all judgment to the Son", John 5:22, Acts 17:31

"and He gave Him authority to execute judgment, because (Reason) He is the Son of Man", John 5:27

from whose (Jesus') presence (face) earth and heaven (celestial) fled away, Rev 20:11

The "earth" and the heavens were created on Day 1 of Creation, Gen 1:1-2, Gen 2:4.

All the **islands** and **mountains** have already **fled away**, in Rev 16:20

The "heavens", include the moon, the sun, the planets, and the stars, Ps 8:3, 33:6, 102:25-26, 2 Pet 3:10-12 "earth and heaven(s) fled away". "fled away", (Grk, pheugo, 5343), "to flee from or away"

or "**passed away**", (Grk, aperchomai, 565) "to cease to exist", as in Rev 21:1, Matt 24:35.

"the present heavens and earth are being reserved (by God) for fire", 2 Pet 3:7

2 Peter 3:10-12

10 But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, in which the heavens will pass away with a roar and the elements will be destroyed with intense heat, and the earth and its works will be burned up.
 11 Since all these things are to be destroyed in this way (burning),

what sort of people ought **you** to be in holy conduct and godliness,

12 looking for and hastening the coming of **the day** of **God**, because of which the heavens will be **destroyed** by **burning**, and **the elements** will **melt** with **intense heat**! Because the heavens and the earth are destroyed by burning and "fled away" or "passed away",

then "no place was found for **them (earth** and **heaven**)", Rev 20:11. Ps 102:25-27, Isa 51:6 Psalm 102:25–26

25 "Of old **You** founded **the earth**, And **the heavens** are the work of **Your hands**.

26 "Even **they** will <mark>perish</mark>, but **You** endure; And **all of them** will <mark>wear out</mark> like a garment; Like clothing **You** will change them and **they** will be changed.

Isaiah 51:6

6 "Lift up your eyes to the sky, Then look to the earth beneath;

For the sky will vanish like smoke, And the earth will wear out like a garment And its inhabitants will die in like manner;

God created all the heavens and the earth supernaturally in a moment, by His power, from nothing, Gen 1:1-2, Gen 2:4, Isa 40:26, 42:5, 45:12, 45:18, 65:17, Rev 4:11, Col 1:16, and God will destroy all the heavens and the earth supernaturally in a moment, by His power, to nothing. Rev 20:11.

the dead standing before the throne, judged according to their deeds, Rev 20:12 Then John saw the dead, the great and the small, standing before the throne,

"the dead" here are resurrected from the grave, dead from Hades, from the earth, and the sea, Rev 20:13.

"the dead" here are Unbelievers, judged by their deeds, and because Not in the book of life, Rev 20:12. All dead Believers, have been resurrected previously in stages.

NAS, "according to their deeds", ESV, "according to what they have done", KJV, "according to their works".

The Resurrection of the righteous or the Resurrection of Life, Chart

Christ was "the First fruits", the First Resurrected, 1 Cor 15:23

Then the resurrection of many bodies of dead saints, Matt 27:52–53, John 5:29

Then the caught up/resurrected of the Church, 1 Thes 4:13–18, John 5:29

Then the resurrection of the two witnesses, Rev 11:3, 11, (assumes they were not resurrected before.)

Then the resurrection of the martyred dead Tribulation saints, Rev 20:4–5, John 5:29

Then the resurrection of OT saints, as in (Isa 26:19–21, Ezek 37:12–14, Dan 12:2–3), not mentioned in Rev 20.

Once "the dead", in Rev 20:12, are resurrected, books (scrolls) were opened, like in Dan 7:9-10. These "Books" have "things" "written" or recorded in them, that Jesus uses to Judge Unbelievers. The "things" "written", must be "their deeds", the "deeds" of Unbelievers, done during their lifetimes. "deeds", (Grk, erga, 2041), things that people do or cause to happen. Deeds or "what they had done", ESV These "deeds" are what God in His all-knowing, omniscience, has kept track of,

But this does Not mean mankind is saved or Not saved by his deeds or his works.

Titus 3:1–7

1 Remind them to be subject to rulers, to authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good deed,

2 to malign **no one**, to be peaceable, gentle, showing every consideration for **all men**.

- **3** For we also once were foolish ourselves, disobedient, deceived, enslaved to various lusts and pleasures, spending our life in malice and envy, hateful, hating one another.
- 4 But when the kindness of God our Savior and His love for mankind appeared,
- 5 He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit,
- 6 whom He poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior,
- **7 so that** being justified by His grace we would be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

Every good **deed** which we (believers) have done in righteousness did not save us, Titus 3:5 We are saved according to His mercy, by regeneration, and by the Holy Spirit, then our good **deeds** follow.

Our good deeds are "the trailer" that follows that saving done by the Father, the Son, and the Spirit, Jn 3:8.

Then **another book (scroll)** was opened, which is **the book of life**; Rev 3:5, 13:8, 17:8, 20:15, 21:27, Dan 12:1, Isa 4:3, Mal 3:16, Lk 10:20, (Blot Out) Ex 32:32, Deut 29:20, Ps 69:28,

the Book of Life see more in Lesson 08 Chart There is a Book, called the Book of Life, that belongs to the Lamb Jesus, Rev 13:8, 21:27 This Book of Life of Jesus was written or prepared from the foundation of the world, Rev 13:8, 17:8 This Book of Life of Jesus only has the names of Overcomers or Believers written in it, Rev 3:5, 21:27 This Book of Life of Jesus determines who will be allowed to come into the New Jerusalem, Rev 21:27 This Book of Life is used by Jesus to Judge Unbelievers that leads to the lake of fire, Rev 20:15 Rev 11:18, Acts 10:42, 17:31, Jn 12:48, 1 Pet 4:5, Ps 9:7-8, 96:12-13, 2 Tim 4:1

Then **the dead resurrected Unbelievers** were **judged** from **the things** which were written in **the books**. Then **the dead resurrected Unbelievers** were **judged** according to **their deeds**.

All judgment, as in decisions, must be made based on a Standard or Law,

different Laws require different judgments.

In our text Jesus is the judge, His Laws are the standard for judging. If you conform to the Law you are Not found guilty, but if you break the Law, even in one point, then you are to be found guilty.

"For whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles in one point, he has become guilty of all", James 2:10 "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord", Rom 6:23

If you break the Law, you are a Criminal. If you are a Criminal you must be Sentenced to a certain Punishment as according to the Law and the Law giver. The Punishment for breaking the Law is a Death Sentence. The Death Sentence is called the Second Death and the Second Death is the Lake of Fire. Then the dead resurrected Unbelievers were judged according to their deeds, based on God's Law.

the sea, Death, and Hades gave up their dead (Bodies) which were in it, Rev 20:13 Then the sea gave up the dead (Bodies) which were in it, Rev 1:18, 6:8, Isa 26:19, 1 Cor 15:26, , Then also, death (Bodies) and Hades (spirits) gave up the dead which were in them; Hades is the temporary place of punishment for the spirits of wicked dead until their final resurrection

and judgment, here in Rev 20:12-15.

Jesus has "the keys of death (a condition) and of Hades (a place)", Rev 1:18

The **4th Seal** Horse rider "had the name **Death**; and **Hades** was following with him", Rev 6:8

The **dead Unbelievers** are raised **bodily** from **their earthly grave**, from **the sea**, or from **death** in general, and **the dead Unbeliever's spirits** or **souls** are caused to come out from **Hades**, **their** abode.

Therefore, their newly resurrected bodies are united with their original spirits, and brought before

the throne of Christ, where they are judged, every one of them, according to their deeds. "the dead to be judged", Rev 11:18,

Jesus/the Lord will judge the Dead, Acts 10:42, 17:31, Jn 12:48, 1 Pet 4:5, Ps 9:7-8, Ps 96:12-13, 2 Tim 4:1 Jesus/the Lord will judge according to deeds, Rev 2:23, 20:12-13, Rom 10:2-3 Jesus/the Lord will Not judge Believers, Jn 5:24

John 5:24

24 "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who hears My word, and believes Him who sent Me, has eternal life, and (he) does not come into judgment, but has passed out of death into (eternal) life.

Then **death** and **Hades** were thrown into **the lake of fire**, **the second death**, Rev 20:13 Then **death** (**Bodies**) and **Hades** (**spirits**) were thrown into **the lake of fire**. Rev 1:18, 6:8, 19:20, 20:15, 21:4, Then All **Unbelieving Resurrected Dead**, were thrown into **the lake of fire**.

Notice that once these **Unbelievers** were **Judged**, **All** or **everyone** is found **guilty**, without exception. **the lake of fire** is where **the Beast** and **the False Prophet** were thrown, **1000 years** before, Rev 19:20 **the lake of fire** is where **Satan** is thrown, Rev 20:10

the lake of fire is where all those Not in the book of life are thrown, Rev 20:15

the second death, is the lake of fire, for Unbelievers

Revelation 2:11

11 'He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.

He who **overcomes</mark> will not be hurt by the second death**.'

Revelation 20:6

6 Blessed and holy is the one who has a part in the first resurrection;

over these (ones) the second death has no power,

but they will be priests of God and of Christ and will reign with Him for a thousand years. Revelation 21:8

8 "But for the cowardly and **unbelieving** and abominable and murderers and immoral persons and sorcerers and idolaters and all liars,

their part will be in the lake that burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death."

Believers or overcomers will not be hurt by the second death, the second death has no power over them. Unbelievers their part will be in the lake that burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death.

Believers are Born twice and Die once.

They are Born of the Flesh and the Born Again of the Spirit and then Die in the Flesh, the first Death. Unbelievers are Born once and Die twice.

They are Born of the Flesh and then Die in the Flesh, the first Death, and then Die the second Death.

"For behold, I (God) create new heavens and a new earth;

And the former things will not be remembered or come to mind", Isa 65:17, Isa 66:22 The first "heaven and earth" was made in the beginning, about 6000 years previously, in Gen 1:1, Isa 37:16. The "heavens", include the moon, the sun, the planets, and the stars, Ps 8:3, 33:6, 102:25-26, 2 Pet 3:10-12

The reason was "for the **first heaven** and the **first earth passed away**", Rev 20:11, 21:4, 2 Pet 3:10, Lk 21:33, Because the original "**earth** and **heaven fled away**", in Rev 20:11

Because "the first things have passed away", in Rev 21:4

Because "the heavens will pass away with a roar and the elements will be destroyed with intense heat, and the earth and its works will be burned up", 2 Peter 3:10, 2 Pet 3:7

"and there is no longer any sea", Rev 21:1

The "sea" was created by God on Day 1, called "the deep", "the waters", in Gen 1:1-2, Gen 1:6-7 The present "heavens and earth" and the "sea" were taken out of existence, by God. Rev 21:1

the holy city, new Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God, Rev 21:2 Chart Then John saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, (new Jerusalem) made ready as a bride adorned for her husband. Rev 21:9-10, 19:7-9, The "new Jerusalem", is a "holy city", Rev 21:2, 21:10, The "new Jerusalem", is the name of the city, written by Jesus on overcomers (Believers), Rev 3:12, The "new Jerusalem", is a city that comes down out of heaven, Rev 21:2, 21:10, 3:12, The "new Jerusalem", is "the Jerusalem above is free; she (Jerusalem) is our mother" Gal 4:26 The "new Jerusalem", is a city the heavenly Jerusalem, Heb 12:22 The "new Jerusalem", is "made ready" or prepared by God, Rev 21:2, Rev 19:7-8 The "new Jerusalem", is "as a bride adorned for her husband". Personification is figurative language in which non-human things are described as having human attributes. The city "was made ready", in heaven, by being "adorned (beautified)" for her husband (the Lamb), Rev 21:9.
